MR. AMODIO: On the roll. 1 2 Commissioner Levine is not here yet. 3 (Roll call was taken, all Commissioners 5 present respond in the affirmative. Commissioner 6 Levine is not present yet) 7 8 MR. AMODIO: Thank you. 9 You have a quorum. 10 The time is 9:40 a.m. 11 All of the requirements of the Open Public 12 Meetings Act have been met. Commission meeting notice have been furnished to all Commissioners, 13 14 City Clerks of Paterson, Passaic, and Clifton, 15 North Jersey Herald News, The Record - Passaic 16 County edition and the Commission's Executive 17 Staff with a copy posted on the main bulletin 18 board at the Clifton facility. 19 Commissioner Levine is now here. 20 If you please rise. 21 Commissioner Bazian, would you please lead 22 us in the Pledge of Allegiance. 23 First item on the agenda will be committee 24 reports. 2.5 Committee reports. We'll start with

1	personnel.
2	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: No, we didn't.
3	MR. AMODIO: No report.
4	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: No report.
5	Sorry.
6	COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: When is the next
7	meeting?
8	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: We're going to
9	make it. You tell me when you can make it.
10	COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: I won't be here
11	next week.
12	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: It won't be next
13	week because we have a special meeting.
14	PRESIDENT VANNOY: Are you here on
15	Tuesday?
16	COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: No.
17	PRESIDENT VANNOY: We have a pay-to-play.
18	If you're not here, you're not here.
19	MR. AMODIO: Finance.
20	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: We finished up,
21	actually, how we're going to do the overtime for
22	this month. Joe has the sheets, hopefully. Does
23	everyone have it?
24	MR. BELLA: I didn't pass it out.
25	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: Maybe you guys can

1 look at it. We just want to know if there's any 2 other input, how you guys want to change. We changed it a little bit. Joe would rather have it 3 go, if somebody wants overtime, it goes to three 4 levels. What's the first level? 5 6 MR. BELLA: If it's a routine thing where 7 it's non-emergency, I want that to be all approved 8 in advance, by department heads, by the director, 9 and myself. COMMISSIONER LEVINE: Wait, wait. 10 11 doesn't get it until Friday. Joe will look at 12 Friday at the end of the week. There will be a 13 signed sheet where the three department heads 14 pre-approve it early and then at the end of the 15 week Joe will see, whether it has a reason why 16 they're doing it and it's pre-approved like a day 17 or two ahead for overtime. 18 PRESIDENT VANNOY: Who are the three 19 department heads? 20 MR. BELLA: That would depend on --21 PRESIDENT VANNOY: Where it's coming from. 22 COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: I have a question. 23 Joe, like, on weekends, you put guys on 24 call, guys that stay home waiting. Are they 25 getting paid?

1	MR. BELLA: Yes, they get paid extra.
2	It's all in the union contract.
3	COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: If you're home
4	waiting for a call
5	MR. BELLA: Right, you get called.
6	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: It's contractual.
7	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: How do you select
8	those?
9	MR. BELLA: Depending on the individual
10	department. Where they are in the rotation, that
11	kind of thing.
12	COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: The question, the
13	supervisor let's say I'm a supervisor, right,
14	and I'm doing a job. The job goes a couple of
15	hours more, a supervisor making overtime, right,
16	is there any way, like, we could
17	PRESIDENT VANNOY: Monitor to see that
18	he's not taking advantage of the extra hours?
19	COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: I wasn't going to
20	put it that way; but.
21	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: I also want to
22	know how the selection process is, because, you
23	know, that's
24	COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: The thing is, you
25	know, the thing that worries me about supervisors

1	getting overtime, Commissioners, you know, it's an
2	inclination. If I'm going to make overtime, not
3	to I'm not saying this is happening, but I
4	would say
5	PRESIDENT VANNOY: No sense of urgency.
6	COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: There's a door
7	there for
8	MR. BELLA: Even the supervisors, it's
9	dependent on their contract. You have to go
10	through the seniority.
11	PRESIDENT VANNOY: Wait, wait.
12	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: This is an answer
13	to your question about the contract.
14	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: A supervisor should
15	do this, too. This is for everyone below Joe
16	Bella.
17	COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: Going beyond that.
18	This contract
19	MR. BELLA: Overtime
20	COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: Can we negotiate?
21	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: We're trying.
22	We're trying.
23	MR. BELLA: We're trying to negotiate.
24	COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: That's a problem.
25	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: My biggest

1	concern, and I guess this goes to Commissioner
2	DeVita, my biggest concern is the selection
3	process. And I mean, I'm not going to tell them
4	how to do their job; but.
5	Anyway, you know what, these are contracts
6	that have been ongoing for decades. We're not
7	going to change it. You know, like, if you have a
8	department, and this is just an example, and if
9	the opportunities are being given across the Board
10	and you're not just doing the same supervisor,
11	that's all I'm saying.
12	COMMISSIONER DeVITA: It's supposed to be
13	on a rotating basis.
14	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: Right.
15	MR. BELLA: It should be.
16	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: Hopefully, it is.
17	MR. BELLA: Absolutely. According to the
18	contract. If not
19	PRESIDENT VANNOY: It should be or it is?
20	MR. BELLA: Well, it should be.
21	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: Can we finish my
22	thing, Bob?
23	First, the overtime and then go back to
24	that. So we can figure out this is the way
25	this is also for anybody below Joe Bella.

1 MR. BELLA: Anybody --

COMMISSIONER LEVINE: We didn't clarify between emergency and non-emergency because Joe didn't want to, then the union will get involved because they should know what the difference is between an emergency. We gave some examples.

MR. BELLA: Department heads should -COMMISSIONER LEVINE: Department heads
should, you know, and Joe's going to look at it at
the end of the week. But, you know, this is for
even supervisors, if they need overtime. They
need to know that, too.

So if there's any other -- take took a look at the sheet, if there's any other ideas you think would work with this. We're just trying it out to see how it does work for the first and then we're going to tweak it after that.

COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: I just want to try get a better overview here.

This is all about accountability. We feel very strongly that Joe is the one ultimately who is responsible. However, he has noticed some of the same things we have noticed. What I think is important about this system is the difference between emergency and non-emergency. He's going

1 to be able to hold his supervisors' feet to the 2 fire because it's not emergency and no, I don't want any overtime period. 3 The emergency situation is where it's 5 difficult to monitor. And, again --6 COMMISSIONER LEVINE: That's going to be at the end of the week they'll review all the 7 emergencies that Joe's going to have in the 8 9 report, the supervisor department head gives. COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: The point I'm 10 11 trying to make is the point you made before, about 12 we cannot quantify every single emergency, although Commissioner Levine tried to. 13 14 But from the stance of the union and 15 grievances and everything, somebody's got to be 16 held accountable and that's the man that has to be held accountable in the emergency situation. 17 18 So we made great strides, but we're 19 sending a very strong message that we're not done 20 yet and this is a work in progress as we all 21 agree. 22 COMMISSIONER DeVITA: This is a daily form 23 for the non-emergency? 24 COMMISSIONER LEVINE: Yes. 25 COMMISSIONER DeVITA: This is done every

1 single day by you? 2 MR. BELLA: Not by me, by the department heads. They'll have to signoff as they project 3 they're going to need that. So they might today 5 say, like, so and so has got to come in on 6 Saturday. They'll put that down. They'll have to sign off on it. That persons' supervisor is going 7 to have to sign off and the director and then it 8 9 comes to me before it even occurs. PRESIDENT VANNOY: So there's three people 10 11 that signoff on it before it gets to you. 12 MR. BELLA: That's right. All of them. COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: Is there -- I'm 13 14 sorry, Mr. President. 15 Is there like a blindfold explanation? 16 COMMISSIONER DeVITA: It says "Reason." 17 COMMISSIONER LEVINE: Can we put the 18 people also that are on call that are getting 19 overtime? Can we do that? 20 COMMISSIONER DeVITA: Just a rotating. 21 COMMISSIONER LEVINE: I'm saying should we 22 put rotating on there? 23 MR. WEISS: People that are on call don't 24 get overtime. They get standby time. It's a flat 2.5 rate standby.

1	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: Joe gets this at the
2	end of the week. Anything below that is a lot of
3	people try to get 45 minutes, it's crazy. They're
4	going to go on the end of the week report, right,
5	Joe? So we know who has below an hour. So
6	someone has 55 minutes a day, five days a week,
7	and then 20 hours a month, it still adds up, you
8	know. If you find accountable for, it's
9	accountable. If it's not, it's not.
10	COMMISSIONER DeVITA: One of the other
11	things, just so everybody knows, that we're
12	discussing with the union is the standby amounts
13	that they receive. So that's kind of a hot and
14	heavy discussion we're having.
15	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: We just want to make
16	sure it's okay to put this in effect. So we're
17	going to try it for next month.
18	PRESIDENT VANNOY: Joe, who monitors the
19	rotation?
20	MR. BELLA: Department heads and
21	supervisors. Department heads.
22	COMMISSIONER DeVITA: Standby?
23	PRESIDENT VANNOY: Rotation, for, you
24	know.
25	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: But you can

1 always get that information, right, Joe? 2 MR. BELLA: Yes, I can. 3 PRESIDENT VANNOY: Commissioner Bazian. COMMISSIONER BAZIAN: The issues about 5 overtime and who's going to get overtime, things 6 like that, I believe are issues that are currently negotiated within the contract and perhaps it 7 might not be a bad idea to go in closed session to 8 9 go over what's on the table so we're all on the 10 same page. 11 PRESIDENT VANNOY: Okay. 12 COMMISSIONER LEVINE: We also need three 13 signatures on this sheet. The other two 14 supervisors. I only see yours on the bottom. You 15 need a spot for department head and director and 16 what's the third? Supervisor, department head, director. 17 18 MR. BELLA: They have a spot right in 19 there. See it? Right --20 COMMISSIONER LEVINE: I see that. Okay. 21 All three would have to sign off. 22 MR. BELLA: And I'll sign the final. 23 COMMISSIONER LEVINE: Where's the person's 24 name? Oh, the name of the person. Reason. 2.5 That's good. We changed it.

MR. AMODIO: This will be for one month 1 2 you're going to try this, Commissioner Levine? 3 COMMISSIONER LEVINE: I think we'll report back next month, how it's working. Then we'll 5 tweak whatever we want. We want to know if you 6 want any discussion on anything you want to add on 7 this or tweak it before we --COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: Do it in closed. 8 9 MR. AMODIO: This will be at the end of 10 the meeting. 11 Anything from IT? 12 COMMISSIONER BAZIAN: I spoke with Jim. We're moving along on the telephone system. I 13 14 believe the equipment is in. We haven't had a 15 meeting so I'll let Jim do a general IT update. 16 So this is the information as I have it. 17 I believe the wiring is scheduled some time in the 18 next two weeks. So that's moving along. 19 The Business Process Review, the kickoff 20 meeting I believe has happened and they're 21 beginning to start. 22 PRESIDENT VANNOY: I think that's what 23 he's doing down there today, right? 24 MR. BELLA: That's correct. They're 2.5 interviewing.

1	So far they're doing all the right things,
2	asking the right questions. Interviewing all the
3	department heads, people that the department heads
4	are in the process, they're also being invited to
5	be interviewed and it's going well.
6	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: I think people
7	should be required. If we're spending that much
8	money to do a Business Process Review, maybe it's
9	a matter of semantics, I think the department
10	heads should be required.
11	MR. BELLA: Oh, they are. Absolutely are.
12	We had that meeting yesterday.
13	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: I heard you say
14	"invited."
15	MR. BELLA: No, no, the department
16	heads are inviting people. No, all the department
17	heads are invited are being interviewed in
18	great detail, actually.
19	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: Okay.
20	MR. AMODIO: Moving on.
21	Legal affairs, anything?
22	COMMISSIONER BAZIAN: Yeah. Legal affairs
23	committee, we're reviewing. We already had one
24	meeting. We'll have one more before we have the
25	next meeting. We're going over all the legal

1	contracts. We're reviewing all the proposals,
2	trying to come up with recommendations for the
3	Board.
4	MR. AMODIO: Would you like to set a
5	meeting for this week?
6	COMMISSIONER BAZIAN: We'll do that during
7	the break.
8	MR. AMODIO: Okay. Any other committee
9	reports?
10	Moving on.
11	Executive Director's report.
12	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: You know what, I
13	also, the next meeting at the finance the main
14	thing is I want to get that Amnesty Program done.
15	I didn't have time this one. I do want to set a
16	meeting up now.
17	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: Okay. Can you
18	discuss that
19	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: That's
20	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: I would discuss
21	that after the meeting. If we start to do that
22	now then we won't be following the agenda.
23	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: When do I set it?
24	After the meeting?
25	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: Yeah, through Lou

1 and your two --2 COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: I would request that --3 COMMISSIONER LEVINE: That's why I wanted 5 to set it up now, so George can make it. 6 COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Apparently, I was 7 one of the people that got the e-mail and I had 8 two questions. Nobody seems to have seen it 9 except me. MR. AMODIO: Moving along, Executive 10 11 Director's report. 12 MR. BELLA: I was going to report on the Business Process Review and the IT. But that's 13 14 all taken care of. 15 COMMISSIONER BAZIAN: Sorry about that. 16 MR. BELLA: That's okay. 17 Just to say it's going well. Everybody is 18 being very cooperative. 19 The other issue we have, we are continuing 20 all of our main rehabilitation. We're working on 21 the 36-inch in Paterson now. That's underway. 22 We've been slowed down by the weather because you 23 can't work in rain. And the filter plant is 24 running well. We had some problems about a week 2.5 or so ago. Everybody responded very well and did

a good job in getting that straightened out. And 1 2 in general, we're, you know, everything is moving 3 along. Jim is going to give a quick report about 5 the reservoir selection process for the 6 consultants and I just turn it over to him. MR. DUPREY: Okay. We're in the process 7 8 of reviewing responses received for the project 9 and it appears that four out of the seven consultants are most qualified. We'll have a 10 11 summary prepared for next Tuesday's special 12 meeting and at that time we'll ask the Commission for permission to conduct interviews. Following 13 14 the interviews, we'll complete our --15 COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: What are you 16 talking about? I'm sorry. 17 MR. BELLA: This is the reservoir project. 18 COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: Oh, I have to... 19 20 (Whereupon, Commissioner Rodriguez recuses 21 herself) 22 23 MR. DUPREY: The four qualified firms are, 24 Gannett Fleming. There's other firms that go with 2.5 them. Gannett Fleming, CH2M Hill, CDM Smith, and

1	Malcolm Pirnie. Following the interviews, we'll
2	complete our reviews and evaluations and we'll
3	bring recommendations concerning award for the
4	project to the Commissioners for consideration at
5	a future meeting.
6	MR. BELLA: We're not going to go any
7	further than that. We'll give you more details at
8	the next meeting. It's still preliminary.
9	COMMISSIONER DeVITA: I assume,
10	thereafter, there will be a recommendation?
11	MR. DUPREY: Correct.
12	MR. BELLA: At the next meeting.
13	COMMISSIONER DeVITA: This committee is
14	MR. BELLA: Jim, myself, Kevin, Laura,
15	Mike Ciolino, Bob and oh, Pat.
16	COMMISSIONER DeVITA: Thank you.
17	MR. AMODIO: Anything further?
18	COMMISSIONER DeVITA: I have a question.
19	Joe, I notice that we have a kind of large
20	increase in revenue, about a million dollars last
21	month.
22	PRESIDENT VANNOY: I'm sorry, Tom, what
23	was that?
24	COMMISSIONER DeVITA: We had over a
25	million dollar increase in revenues.

MR. BELLA: For sale of water. 1 2 COMMISSIONER DeVITA: Is there any way we can consider that for other means? 3 MR. BELLA: You understand that, in this, 4 5 this is not necessarily cash that we've actually 6 received. This is the equivalent. What we're 7 trying to do is give you a sense that, you know, 8 we sold more water in a particular period than in 9 another one. 10 11 (Whereupon, Commissioner Rodriguez 12 returns) 13 14 COMMISSIONER DeVITA: This is the project. 15 MR. BELLA: No, especially this time of 16 year. So it's a little harder to project. But we 17 sold more water, more wholesale water, last month 18 or in the last, I guess, that was April. And a 19 lot -- and March. March in particular, it's kind 20 of interesting. This is for April. But in March 21 we actually had a little bump because of the warm 22 weather, people are starting to go out. 23 really needs to see how it plays out. 24 COMMISSIONER DeVITA: Can I bring up one 2.5 more thing?

1 PRESIDENT VANNOY: Yes. 2 COMMISSIONER DeVITA: I got a letter awhile ago addressed to me as President. Sorry. 3 PRESIDENT VANNOY: Who sent that letter? COMMISSIONER DeVITA: Corey Booker. 5 6 Just advising us that Newark completed their repairs and thanking the Commissioners for 7 allowing Newark to share the Great Notch Reservoir 8 9 while Cedar Grove was drained. And greatly 10 appreciated the support for us by your Executive 11 Director, Joseph Bella, and his team for their 12 efforts. Without their cooperation, it would not 13 have been possible. So that's a nice thing. 14 MR. BELLA: Our people worked real 15 closely. They did a great job. 16 COMMISSIONER SANCHEZ: Mr. President, our 17 water levels, we have some rain. I guess we need 18 more rain, right? How we doing with the water level? 19 20 MR. BELLA: In general, it's not bad. 21 lot of that had to do with the fact that we had 22 such wet weather during the early part of the 23 winter. Right now, Wanaque, that's the one we all 24 really watch is about 82 to 85 percent, which is 2.5 not too bad. I mean, it's still within the long

1	term average. Not too bad. You know, all this
2	additional rain, it all adds up. Stopped taking
3	water from Wanaque, that helped the Wanaque
4	Reservoir rebound.
5	So, again, it's not perfect, but it's not
6	bad either. We did have a dry spell. You know,
7	that's one of the things I always said, if you
8	have a dry April, you're going to have a wet May,
9	which hurts us in terms of revenues. May can be a
10	fairly decent month sometimes. You have a wet
11	April, you have a dry May; so.
12	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: Who said that?
13	MR. BELLA: Me. I've been watching
14	weather for 45 years.
15	MR. AMODIO: Moving along.
16	You have the request to use the Point View
17	Reservoir from Passaic County Police Academy. We
18	have all of the paperwork documentation, the hold
19	harmless and
20	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: I'll move.
21	MR. AMODIO: Motion by Commissioner
22	Kolodziej.
23	COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: Second.
24	MR. AMODIO: By Commissioner Rodriguez.
25	On the roll.

(Roll call was taken, all Commissioners 1 2 respond in the affirmative) 3 MR. AMODIO: I'll have that signed today. 5 Moving along, we have the Controller's 6 Report. 7 MR. WEISS: Cash on hand is 15.3 million. Our accounts receivable is at 11.3 8 9 million. Thirty days or less accounts receivable is 10.6 million. 10 11 Accounts payable is at 4.3 million. 12 Our audit is complete. We've got the draft audit already. Joe and I have a meeting 13 14 with the auditors tomorrow to review it. So we'll 15 have the finalized audit to give to you for next 16 month. 17 You have copies of the overtime reports as 18 well as several others, the year-to-date budget. 19 The overtime figures actually look very good 20 compared to last year. They're down 30 percent 21 over what last year's numbers were. The last 22 year's overtime was about at 13 percent of salary 23 through the first four months of the year. This 24 year's overtime is down to nine percent, which is

2.5

very good.

1 We've got some updates on, as far as 2 numbers and financing options for Lodi, but I think those will be discussed in closed session. 3 COMMISSIONER RODRIGUEZ: Yes. 5 MR. AMODIO: Any questions? 6 Hearing none, motion to enter closed 7 session. COMMISSIONER BAZIAN: Move. 8 9 COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Second. MR. AMODIO: WHEREAS, Section 8 of the 10 11 Open Public Meetings Act permits the exclusion of 12 the public from a meeting in certain 13 circumstances; and 14 WHEREAS, the public body is of the opinion 15 that such circumstances presently exist; 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the 17 Commissioners of Passaic Valley Water Commission: 18 1. The public shall be excluded from 19 discussion of the hereinafter specified subject 20 matters; the general nature of the subject matters 21 being: Financial, Insurance, Personnel, 22 Contracts, Negotiations, Security. Under Law we 23 have Summary/Aging Reports, McCullough and 24 Kadzielawa versus PVWC, Prismatic/Leopold/Filters. 25 Under Personnel we have --

1	MR. HANLEY: I wanted to add one, if I
2	may?
3	MR. AMODIO: Of course.
4	MR. HANLEY: Easements, Nutley.
5	MR. AMODIO: Under Administration, you
6	have Lyndhurst Agreement, Shut-Off/Bad Check
7	Policy, DEP allocation, Project #12-P-20 and any
8	other matter as may be discussed in camera.
9	2. It is anticipated at this time that
10	the above-stated subject matters will be ratified
11	during public meeting following or as soon
12	thereafter as the reason for discussion no longer
13	exists.
14	3. This Resolution shall take effect
15	immediately.
16	Second by Commissioner Kolodziej.
17	On the roll.
18	
19	(Roll call was taken, all Commissioners
20	respond in the affirmative)
21

25	session.

1	On the roll.
2	
3	(Roll call was taken, all Commissioners
4	present respond in the affirmative. Commissioners
5	Sanchez and Levine are not present in the room)
6	
7	MR. AMODIO: You have a quorum.
8	The time is 11:18 a.m.
9	We'll move onto Consent Agenda.
10	We got the minutes of Passaic Valley Water
11	Commission <u>in</u> <u>camera</u> and Regular Public Session
12	Meeting minutes held on April 18th, 2012.
13	COMMISSIONER BAZIAN: Move.
14	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Second.
15	MR. AMODIO: Move by Commissioner Bazian.
16	Second by Commissioner Kolodziej.
17	On the roll.
18	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: What's this for?
19	MR. AMODIO: The minutes.
20	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: I'm going to
21	abstain, I didn't read them.
22	
23	(Roll call was taken, all Commissioners
24	present respond in the affirmative. Commissioner
25	Levine abstained. Commissioner Sanchez is not in

1	the room)
2	
3	MR. AMODIO: Thank you.
