OVERVIEW OF PROPOSED PROVISIONS OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE LEGACY POLLUTION CLEANUP ACT OF 2021 ("EJLPA")

EXHIBIT A

The Environmental Justice Legacy Pollution Cleanup Act of 2021

Lead Sponsors: Senator Cory Booker (D-NJ), Congressman A. Donald McEachin (VA-04)

Background

As a result of <u>decades of discrimination</u>, low-income communities, communities of color, and Indigenous communities are significantly more likely to suffer sickness and death from high levels of air pollution, contaminated drinking water, close <u>proximity to toxic waste</u> sites, and other legacy pollution. In order for these communities to fully share in the recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, Congress must address this historic injustice. The Environmental Justice Legacy Pollution Cleanup Act (EJLPA) will immediately invest \$200 billion to clean up this legacy pollution. The bill will:

Cleanup Toxic and Hazardous Waste

- 24% of all households below the poverty level and 28% of all people of color live within three miles of the most dangerous Superfund sites. And despite making up only 39.6% of the general population, people of color represent nearly 50% of the population living within one mile of a Superfund site. This bill's provision of \$10 billion to the EPA Superfund National Priorities List will accelerate the clean up of these toxic sites and help clear the largest backlog of unfunded sites since 2004.
- Abandoned coal mines pose a <u>significant risk</u> to public health. The EJLPA provides \$10 billion to the Abandoned Mine Reclamation Fund, an investment that could fund the reclamation of <u>nearly</u> <u>every</u> eligible abandoned mine lands site.
- Abandoned hard rock mines, including uranium mines, also pose a significant risk to public health. Approximately 600,000 Native Americans live within six miles of an abandoned mine. With priority given to sites located on tribal land, this bill dedicates \$10 billion to the Environmental Protection Agency Superfund Program to remediate abandoned hard rock mines.
- Contaminated sites that are not safe for public or commercial use, known as 'brownfields,' are located <u>disproportionately</u> in communities of color. This bill would provide \$3 billion for grants to remediate brownfield sites. Such remediation efforts are a <u>major boon</u> to economically depressed communities, producing roughly \$20 in economic benefits for every \$1 spent.
- There are over 1,700 formerly used military sites that contain hazardous, toxic, and radioactive waste, which pose a threat to drinking water and public health. This bill, which provides \$10 billion to the Formerly Used Defense Sites Program will clean up 20% of these sites. The EJLPA also commits \$3 billion to the Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program, which will remediate tens of thousands of acres of formerly radioactive land and return hundreds of properties back to public use.

Improve Air Quality

Diesel engine exhaust increases people's risk for cancer, respiratory illness, and heart disease, and even reduces cognitive performance in children. Studies show that the 25 million children who ride diesel school buses breathe air that can be several times more polluted than the outside air —

- something that disproportionately affects children in low-income and working class households, who are <u>more likely</u> to take the bus. The EJLPA includes \$30 billion to replace over 50% of diesel school buses with zero emission school buses in the most disadvantaged school districts.
- Decades of discriminatory practices in urban planning have left communities of color with deficiencies in green spaces and tree canopy cover a crucial line of defense against heat waves, air pollution, and flooding. The EJLPA commits \$25 billion to urban tree planting initiatives, an investment that will plant an estimated 100 million trees in low-income communities.

Address Lead, Clean Water, and Sanitation Issues

- Childhood lead poisoning continues to cause irreversible brain damage and other life-threatening health conditions, <u>particularly</u> in low-income communities and communities of color. This bill will inject \$30 billion into U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development grant programs to remediate lead-based paint hazards in housing, the <u>leading cause</u> of childhood lead poisoning in the United States. It would substantially eliminate lead paint in low income housing.
- 23% of Native American homes have at least one dangerous issue, such as lead paint, mold, or poor ventilation. This bill provides \$1 billion for grants to tribal governments to address housing-related safety hazards.
- An American Water Works Association <u>study</u> estimates that Lead Service Lines (LSLs) supply water for 15-22 million Americans, a population that <u>disproportionately</u> contains low-income communities and communities of color. The EJLPA will provide \$30 billion in funding for EPA grant programs that supply funding to states, tribal governments, and localities to replace LSLs a figure that could fund the replacement of <u>nearly</u> every lead service line in the country.
- Nearly 2 million Americans lack access to adequate plumbing or sanitation, with African Americans and Latinos twice as likely to lack basic access. This bill commits \$10 billion in funding to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Decentralized Water Systems Program, which will give nonprofits capacity to provide grants to over 660,000 homes to construct or improve individual household water well and wastewater systems.
- Native Americans are 19 times more likely than whites to lack access to basic indoor plumbing (including running water and flushable toilets) more than any other demographic group. By providing \$3 billion to the Indian Health Service (IHS) to build and renovate sanitation infrastructure, this bill will bring safe drinking water and adequate sewage systems to every American Indian and Alaskan Native household.
- 850+ cities across the United States collect rainwater, industrial waste, and domestic sewage in combined sewer systems, which overflow during heavy rainfall or snowmelt and discharge untreated sewage into people's basements, parks and waterways. These overflows expose people to dangerous diseases, make rivers/lakes unsafe to use, and impose <u>burdensome</u> cleanup costs on low income households and environmental justice communities. The EJPLA provides \$25 billion to the EPA to address combined sewer overflows, which will eliminate most overflow problems in economically distressed communities.

WHEREAS, Passaic Valley Water Commission ("PVWC") and the City of Newark, Department of Water and Sewer Utilities (also referred to herein as "Newark" and/or the "City") entered into a joint venture partnership (also referred to herein as the "Joint Venture" and/or the "Joint Venture Partnership"), and Project No. 18-P-JV "Professional Services for Feasibility Assessment of a Joint Distribution System Water Storage Project" (hereinafter the "Project") was subsequently awarded by the Joint Venture Partnership to Arcadis U.S., Inc. of Fair Lawn, New Jersey ("Arcadis"); and

WHEREAS PVWC's portion of the Joint Venture Partnership Agreement was awarded at PVWC's Commission Meeting dated June 20, 2018 (PVWC Resolution 18-36) in accordance with the authorized scope of work, and with PVWC responsible for its portion (\$246,382.50) of the time and materials, total not-to-exceed amount of \$492,765.00 as set forth in the Agreement, and with Newark responsible for the remaining half of the said total not-to-exceed amount; and

WHEREAS, the original Agreement provides that PVWC and Newark will each pay one-half of Arcadis' approved invoices, which includes reimbursements for any and all subsequent changes in the scope of the Agreement as may be authorized and approved by the

duly authorized representatives of the respective governing bodies of the Joint Venture Partnership; and

WHEREAS, the Amendment, which is the subject of this Resolution, includes additional professional services and related costs that were not included in Arcadis' original proposal, and not included as part of the original Agreement; and

WHEREAS, at the Joint Venture Partnership's request, Arcadis has submitted a proposal dated March 26, 2021 (the "Proposal") for additional professional services and related costs as set forth in more detail therein, and a copy of same is included as an attachment to the form of amendment to the Agreement included in Exhibit B referenced below; and

WHEREAS, Arcadis' Proposal for the additional Work has been reviewed by authorized representatives of the Joint Venture Partnership and found to be reasonable, considering the nature and scope of additional Work involved; and

WHEREAS, a copy of PVWC's Director of Engineering's memorandum dated March 26, 2021 recommending approval, on PVWC's behalf, of the said changes to the Project is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, PVWC's Executive Director; and the General Counsel, (as to form and legality); have reviewed the above-referenced memorandum and concur with the Director of Engineering's recommendations; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the Form of Amendment to the Agreement for Professional Services (Project 18-P-JV) (the "Amendment") followed by a copy of the Proposal, including a breakdown of the scope and additional costs related thereto, is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the previously approved not-to-exceed total price of \$492,765.00 is hereby increased by the additional amount of

\$102,500.00 (an increase of 20.8% over the original not-to-exceed price) for the Amendment as set forth herein, for a revised not-to-exceed total price of \$595,265.00 for the Project; and

WHEREAS, PVWC's share (one half) of the amount of this Amendment is **\$51,250.00**, with Newark responsible for the remaining half; and

whereas, the additional services to be rendered pursuant hereto constitute professional services (or extraordinary unspecifiable services) within the meaning and intent of the Local Public Contracts Law; and

WHEREAS, PVWC's Comptroller has certified, with respect hereto, that the funds needed to satisfy PVWC's share of the Amendment (\$51,250.00) are currently available for said purpose and said certificates are attached hereto as Exhibit C;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by Passaic Valley Water Commission, in the County of Passaic, New Jersey;

- 1. That PVWC, in conjunction with Newark and contingent upon Newark's concurrent approval of the Agreement, hereby approves the Amendment to the Agreement for Professional Services for Project 18-P-JV (the "Amendment"); all as set forth hereinabove, and
- 2. That the appropriate officials of PVWC, and such other officers, employees and officials of PVWC, on behalf of PVWC, in conjunction with Newark, and contingent upon Newark's concurrent award of the Amendment, are hereby authorized to execute and enter into the said Amendment, and to perform such other acts and execute such documents as are necessary to implement the terms and intentions of this Resolution, and

Summary

C:

Under Project 18-P-JV, it is recommended that Arcadis U.S., Inc. ("Arcadis") of Fair Lawn, New Jersey be awarded an increase of \$102,500.00 (increasing the total previously approved stipulated not-to-exceed amount for Project 18-P-JV from \$492,765.00 to \$595,265.00 (a 20.8% increase) to provide the Joint Venture Partnership with additional professional services.

PVWC's share (one half) of the amount of this Amendment is **\$51,250.00**, with Newark responsible for the remaining half.

These recommended modifications under this proposed Amendment are set forth in more detail below.

Background

Passaic Valley Water Commission ("PVWC") and the City of Newark, Department of Water and Sewer Utilities (also referred to herein as "Newark" and/or the "City") entered into a joint venture partnership (also referred to herein as the "Joint Venture" and/or the "Joint Venture Partnership"), and Project No. 18-P-JV "Professional Services for Feasibility Assessment of a Joint Distribution System Water Storage Project" (hereinafter the "Project") was subsequently awarded by the Joint Venture Partnership to Arcadis U.S., Inc. of Fair Lawn, New Jersey ("Arcadis").

PVWC's portion of the Joint Venture Partnership Agreement was awarded at PVWC's Commission Meeting dated June 20, 2018 (PVWC Resolution 18-36) in accordance with the authorized scope of work, and with PVWC responsible for its portion (\$246,382.50) of the time and materials, total not-to-exceed amount of \$492,765.00 as set forth in the Agreement, and with Newark responsible for the remaining half of the said total not-to-exceed amount.

The original Agreement provides that PVWC and Newark will each pay one-half of Arcadis' approved invoices, which includes reimbursements for any and all subsequent changes in the scope of the Agreement as may be authorized and approved by the duly authorized representatives of the respective governing bodies of the Joint Venture Partnership.

The Amendment, which is the subject of the herein Resolution, includes additional professional services and related costs that were not included in Arcadis' original proposal, nor in the original Agreement.

At the Joint Venture Partnership's request, Arcadis has submitted a proposal dated March 26, 2021 (the "Proposal") for additional professional services and related costs as set forth in more detail therein, and which additional professional services were not included in Arcadis' original proposal, and not included as part of the original Agreement, and a copy of the Proposal is included as an attachment to the form of amendment to the Agreement included in Exhibit B following this memorandum.

Arcadis' Proposal for the additional Work has been reviewed by authorized representatives of the Joint Venture Partnership and found to be reasonable, considering the nature and scope of additional Work involved, and it is recommended that the said modifications to the Project, and additional costs related thereto, be approved.

A copy of the form of Amendment to the Agreement for Professional Services (Project 18-P-JV) ("Amendment") followed by a copy of the Proposal, including a breakdown of the scope and additional costs related thereto, is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

The previously approved not-to-exceed total price of \$492,765.00 is hereby increased by the additional amount of \$102,500.00 (an increase of 20.8% over the original not-to-exceed price) for the Amendment as set forth herein, for a revised not-to-exceed total price of \$595,265.00 for the Project.

PVWC's share (one half) of the amount of this Amendment is **\$51,250.00**, with Newark responsible for the remaining half.

It is recommended that PVWC, in conjunction with Newark and contingent upon Newark's concurrent approval of the Amendment, approve the Amendment to the Agreement for Professional Services for Project 18-P-JV all as set forth hereinabove.

Subject to concurrence and approval by PVWC's Law Department, on PVWC's behalf, as to form and legality, the said changes will be incorporated into "Amendment to Agreement for Professional services (Project 18-P-JV)" the form of which is included in Exhibit B.

Passaic Valley Water Commission Amendment to the Agreement for Professional Services (Project 18-P-JV)

The City of Newark, Department of Water and Sewer Utilities ("Newark" and/or the "City") and Passaic Valley Water Commission ("PVWC") previously entered into a joint venture partnership, also referred to herein as the "Joint Venture" and /or the "Joint Venture Partnership" for Project 18-P-JV entitled "Professional Services for Feasibility Assessment of a Joint Distribution System Water Storage Project".

This Amendment to the Agreement for Professional Services for Project 18-P-JV (hereinafter "Amendment") is made by and between:

The Joint Venture Partnership (consisting of The City of Newark, Department of Water and Sewer Utilities ("Newark" and/or the "City") and The Passaic Valley Water Commission ("PVWC")

and

Arcadis U.S., Inc. of Fairlawn, New Jersey ("Arcadis")

The Joint Venture Partnership and Arcadis are hereinafter referred to collectively as the "Parties" or either one of them as "Party".

IT IS hereby agreed as follows:

Article 1 Recitals

- 1.01. On or about June 20, 2018, the Joint Venture Partnership and Arcadis entered into an Agreement for "Professional Services for Feasibility Assessment of a Joint Distribution System Water Storage Project" (hereinafter "Agreement") referred to as Project 18-P-JV, not to exceed the amount of \$492,765.00.
- **1.02** At the Joint Venture Partnership's request, Arcadis submitted a proposal dated March 26, 2021 (the "Proposal") for additional professional services and related costs as set forth in more detail therein.
 - 1.02.01 Additional professional services included in the herein Amendment were not included in Arcadis' original proposal.
 - 1,02.02 The Amendment includes additional professional services and related costs incurred by Arcadis.
- **1.03** The Joint Venture Partnership has reviewed Arcadis' claim, and the Parties hereby agree to the claim.
- **1.04** The amount of Arcadis' requested claim is memorialized in a 3-Page cover letter dated March 26, 2021, issued by Gerald M. Spiesbach, Associate Vice President, on behalf of Arcadis to Kareem Adeem, Director (for Newark) and to Joseph Bella, Executive Director (for PVWC) (hereinafter "Compromise").
- **1.05** By enacting this Amendment, the not-to-exceed amount of this agreement changes as follows:

Article 2 Acceptance of Compromise

- **2.01.** Acceptance of Compromise. The Parties accept the Compromise and adopt same as an amendment to the Agreement, thereby increasing the not-to-exceed amount of the Agreement by \$102,500.00 for a new total of \$595,265.00.
- **2.02** Compromise Incorporated. The Compromise is incorporated herein and made a part of the terms and conditions of this Amendment.
- **2.03** Effective Date. The Effective date of this Amendment shall be the date on which this Amendment is fully executed by, and delivered to, all Parties hereto and the Joint Venture Partnership's respective governing bodies have duly authorized their

respective entities (Newark and PVWC) to execute, deliver and be bound by the terms of this Amendment. Unless and until the Joint Venture Partnership's respective governing bodies have duly authorized or ratified this Amendment, this Amendment shall have no force or effect and shall be null and void.

- **2.04** Full and Final Settlement of Arcadis' claim. Arcadis agrees that this Amendment shall constitute full and final compensation to Arcadis for any and all claims for additional compensation in connection with the agreement that were, or could have been, asserted against the Joint Venture Partnership, and/or PVWC and/or Newark by Arcadis or requested from the Joint Venture Partnership, and/or PVWC and/or Newark by Arcadis, as of the date of the Compromise. A claim could have been asserted if Arcadis had knowledge of one or more events that impacted Arcadis negatively in any way, whether or not Arcadis had enough information at the time to sufficiently quantify the impact and/or substantiate the claim under the terms of the Agreement. Arcadis may not re-assert any claim that it has asserted previously in connection with the Compromise.
- **2.05** Reservation of Right. Arcadis reserves the right to assert a claim or request an increase in compensation in connection with the Agreement for any claims that were unknown as of the date of the Compromise and could not have been asserted by Arcadis before the date of the Compromise. In addition:
- **2.06** Although the Joint Venture Partnership foresees the possibility that Arcadis may request another increase in their compensation under the Agreement at some point in the future, the Joint Venture Partnership does not take any position on future claims that have been reserved by Arcadis and nothing herein shall bind the Joint Venture Partnership to increase Arcadis' compensation beyond the not-to-exceed amount set forth in this Amendment.

Article 3 Construction of the Amendment

- **3.01** Agreement. The Parties remain bound by all provisions in the Agreement that are not amended herein or are not inconsistent with this Amendment. Unless a specific walver is made herein, both Parties reserve all of their rights and claims under the Agreement as amended.
- **3.02** Severability. If any of the provisions of this amendment are determined to be invalid under any applicable state or federal laws, such invalidity shall not affect or impair the validity of the other provisions, which shall be considered severable, and shall remain in full force and effect.
- **3.03** Counterparts. The Amendment may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same agreement. Digital signatures shall be deemed original signatures for purposes of this Amendment.
- **3.04** Neutral Construction. The Amendment shall be given a neutral construction, such that it shall not be construed in favor or against any party to this Amendment by reason of the extent to which any party or its Counsel participated in the drafting hereof.
- **3.05** Recitals. The recitals set forth in Article 1 of this Amendment shall be construed as terms to the Amendment and not mere recitals.
- **3.06** Signatories' Representations. By signing this Amendment, each of the undersigned represents that s/he is duly authorized to enter into this Amendment and to legally bind his/her respective Party to same.

Task 5 Review and Evaluate Runoff

• Arcadis completed the runoff evaluation without receiving the guidance from NJDEP that has been requested by both Arcadis and the JV on multiple occasions for an appropriate design storm. To date the runoff mitigation measures have been conceptually designed with the 100-year storm interval. Since there could be significant construction savings to the Joint Venture if a more frequent rainfall interval is approved by the NJDEP, Arcadis recommends that the construction cost estimate be updated for a more reasonable and frequent design storm. Arcadis will require an additional \$10,000 to update the construction cost estimates.

Task 6 Alternative Evaluation

- A key tool needed to complete the evaluation of alternatives was the development of a merged water model using the existing water models provided from each of the Joint Venture partners. During the early stages of model development, it became apparent that the two models were not compatible, were set at different datums and required additional data inputs including pump curves and nodes for future demands and pressure zones not previously contained in either of the provided models. Since the accuracy of the model was critically important to the Alternatives Analysis, significant additional effort was appropriately expended to develop, upgrade and fine tune the merged model. The developed model will be beneficial to the Joint Venture as this project moves to implementation.
- Upon completion of the initial merged hydraulic model, it was noted by the Joint
 Venture that one of the previously provided hydraulic model was not the most
 current model. As a result, this required Arcadis to revisit the modeling effort and
 reconfigure the new model pursuant to the information already developed. In
 addition, the Alternatives Analysis that had been underway needed to be revised
 based on the corrected and finalized model.
- At the request of the Joint Venture, Arcadis developed a formal Hydraulic Modeling Memorandum prior to submission of the draft Feasibility Report. This deliverable was not included in the scope of work.
- The Joint Venture requested Arcadis evaluate upstream and downstream storage locations, as opposed to locating tanks within the footprint of either Great Notch or Cedar Grove Reservoirs, which was not included in the scope of services.
- The additional cost for time required to complete this Task is \$75,000.

As detailed above, Arcadis requests that the Joint Venture authorize Arcadis an amendment of \$102,500 to our original agreement to reflect the additional unanticipated services not in our proposed scope of work to complete the study. While there are two allowances in the project budget for additional services, Arcadis recommends that those allowances remain available to allow for any subsequent activities that may be required by the Joint Venture.

CONTINUOUS MONITORING FOR TOTAL CHLOROPHYLL-a, PHYCOCYANIN, AND TURBIDITY AT PASSAIC RIVER BELOW TWO BRIDGES, NEW JERSEY

Modifications to the original workplan are noted in red

Problem

Demands on water resources in New Jersey require the availability of high-quality water for multiple uses. Numerous sources of pollution have deteriorated the quality of water resources within the State. Water resources planning must address these and other problems to ensure a water supply of high quality to meet future water needs. To assist in the management of these resources, continuous monitoring of water-quality conditions provides the necessary information on the quality of water resources. Continuous monitoring of turbidity, chlorophyll-a, and phycocyanin in combination with existing continuous monitoring of dissolved oxygen and pH improve the identification of algal blooms, which, in turn, lead to degraded water quality downstream of the monitoring location. When the algal biomass is too great, the health of other aquatic biota may be adversely affected. Excessive algae concentrations of certain classes, such as blue-green, also create taste, odor, and water clarity issues for the production of drinking water. Water resource managers, when made aware of incipient algal blooms, may change or blend the source waters to obtain optimal water quality for water treatment.

Objective and Scope

To provide a continuous record of turbidity, chlorophyll-a, and phycocyanin concentrations in the Passaic River downstream from the confluence with the Pompton River at Two Bridges, New Jersey. The status of turbidity, chlorophyll-a as a measure of phytoplankton biomass, and phycocyanin concentrations will be monitored for the purpose of planning and managing water resources in the Passaic River.

Approach

Concentrations of turbidity, total chlorophyll-a, and phycocyanin will be measured hourly on the Passaic River downstream from the confluence with the Pompton River using the monitoring station at Two Bridges, New Jersey. Turbidity and chlorophyll-a/phycocyanin sensors will be operated at the existing monitoring station. The sensors will be operated and maintained to record chlorophyll-a and phycocyanin concentrations hourly from two locations and turbidity at 3 locations along a cross section of the river for the period October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021. Phycocyanin monitoring will begin April 1, 2021 and will continue through September 30, 2021.

Water samples will be collected during every routine inspection (approximately every 6 weeks) and up to an additional 10 times per year depending on conditions. Chlorophyll-a samples will be sent to the USGS National Water Quality Laboratory (NWQL) for analysis of total chlorophyll-a and total Pheophytin-a. Phycocyanin samples will be analyzed by BSA Environmental Services for analysis of phycocyanin through NWQL contract. The laboratory analyses will be compared to the continuous monitor data to determine if the chlorophyll and phycocyanin measurements from the chlorophyll-a/phycocyanin sensor correlate with the lab analyses. The equipment will be calibrated as needed to minimize the difference between the laboratory results and the monitor readings.



Operation and Maintenance



PASSAIC VALLEY WATER COMMISSION FORM OF AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT (hereinafter "AGREEMENT") made as of ______, 20__ between PASSAIC VALLEY WATER COMMISSION ("PVWC"), a Public Utility Company organized pursuant to its enabling statute (N.J.S.A. 40:62-108 et seq.), having its principal place of business at 1525 Main Avenue, Clifton, New Jersey 07011 and JGSC Group, LLC a professional firm (hereinafter "PROFESSIONAL" and/or "contractor") having a place of business at P.O. Box 1148 Merchantville, New Jersey 08109.

WHEREAS, PVWC desires professional services as applicable, to assist PVWC in its ongoing efforts related to Project No. 21-P-60 entitled "Professional Services for Public Outreach and Participation for the Water Storage Improvement Projects" (hereinafter the "PROJECT"); and

WHEREAS, PVWC requires Professional Services to assist it in implementing the PROJECT; and:

WHEREAS, PROFESSIONAL represents that it has the experience and the required professional knowledge to provide the professional services, and/or extraordinary unspecifiable services, as applicable (hereinafter "PROFESSIONAL SERVICES"), and as required by PVWC in this regard as set forth in the "Public Notice", "Table of Contents", and the "Request for Proposals" of the "Request for Proposals for Professional Services (or Extraordinary Unspecifiable Services)", and Appendices A, B, C, & F of the Solicitation (and including, where applicable, Appendix D with additional technical and other requirements attached thereto); all of which, along with a copy of the PROFESSIONAL'S proposal dated March 11, 2021 are collectively referred to herein as the "PROPOSAL" are attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the AGREEMENT shall be for the period of time as set forth in Appendix D where applicable, or where not otherwise set forth in Appendix D, the Agreement shall be for up to a one-year period of time commencing on the Effective Date of this AGREEMENT as defined in Paragraph 19 herein, and for any extended periods authorized by PVWC.

WHEREAS, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL are desirous of entering into a consulting agreement to cover the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES authorized by PVWC and required for the PROJECT; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL agree that the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT are the following:

- 1. PROFESSIONAL shall provide the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES authorized by PVWC and required for the PROJECT. PROFESSIONAL'S obligations under this AGREEMENT are solely for the benefit of PVWC and no other party is intended to benefit or have rights hereunder.
- PROFESSIONAL shall perform the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES as defined under this AGREEMENT at a level customary for competent and prudent professional service providers, all as applicable, performing such services at the time and place where the services are provided ("STANDARD OF CARE"). These services will be provided by professional service providers in the appropriate disciplines, and by other professionals and individuals skilled in other technical disciplines, as appropriate. PROFESSIONAL shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion and the coordination of all aspects of its services including reports and other deliverables and services provided under this AGREEMENT. The services to be performed by PROFESSIONAL shall conform to the generally accepted codes and regulations applicable to the subject PROJECT. PROFESSIONAL agrees to indemnify and hold PVWC harmless from all losses and damages resulting from PROFESSIONAL'S failure to meet the STANDARD OF CARE. Further, PROFESSIONAL shall correct and re-perform any services not conforming to the required STANDARD OF CARE without additional compensation and cost to PVWC, (including, but not limited to pending written or oral testimony, reports, etc., which might occur from activities resulting from the performance of this AGREEMENT which were caused by PROFESSIONAL'S performance). In addition, PROFESSIONAL shall indemnify and hold harmless PVWC and its officers, agents and employees of

PVWC from and against any losses, claims, damages, or liabilities to which PVWC may become subject insofar as and to the extent they arise out of the deviation from the STANDARD OF CARE in the performance of the services by the PROFESSIONAL, hereunder.

- The cost of services for the PROJECT shall be invoiced by the PROFESSIONAL on a Time-and-Materials basis, not-to-exceed \$156,068.00 PROFESSIONAL shall invoice PVWC its services hereunder after completion thereof and on the basis of reports and accompanying documents, if appropriate, on a monthly basis, including therein information as to progress in performance as against one hundred percent (100%) completion thereof and also showing amounts previously compensated hereunder, as against the total authorization. When the billing amount for actual work performed and costs incurred during the period covered by the invoice is less than \$1,000 the PROFESSIONAL shall add the service and costs to the next billing cycle. To the extent items appearing on invoices presented by PROFESSIONAL are not contested, PVWC will remit payment of the invoice as soon as it can reasonably process same in the normal course of business and barring any failure of systems related thereto or unusual staffing shortages. If at any time it appears to PROFESSIONAL that the proposed scope of services to be performed on the different aspects of any PROJECT will exceed that which was authorized by PVWC, PROFESSIONAL shall clearly indicate same in its continuing written reports. The PROJECT shall be invoiced separately. Each invoice shall include a breakdown of hours expended along with the names of individual expending said hours, along with a breakdown of charges from subcontractors where applicable and out-of-pocket expenses chargeable to the PROJECT. Each invoice shall include a summary sheet including total amount billed for the time period covered by the invoice and the time period covered, total amount billed to date, total not-to-exceed dollar amount for cost of services (said amounts as set forth or defined in Paragraph 3 herein), and balance remaining.
- 4. PROFESSIONAL shall be responsible to PVWC for any subcontractors and outside associates or professional it engages to assist it in the performance of the services required under this AGREEMENT.
- 5. PVWC will provide to PROFESSIONAL all available information, including previous reports and any other data in its possession relevant to the subject PROJECT. Further, PVWC will be responsible for providing PROFESSIONAL access to all public and private property in connection with services to be performed for the PROJECT.
- 6. Both PVWC and PROFESSIONAL understand that the goal of this AGREEMENT is to complete all phases of the subject PROJECT in a reasonably expeditious fashion. To this end each pledge to the other full cooperation.
- 7. The services to be performed under this AGREEMENT for the PROJECT shall be deemed to be completed when the scope of work authorized by PVWC for the PROJECT has satisfactorily been fulfilled.
- 8. By notice in writing at any time, PVWC may change the general scope of services required by PROFESSIONAL as set forth herein. In such event an equitable adjustment, if appropriate, in compensation shall be agreed to in writing prior to PROFESSIONAL'S performing the changed services.
- 9. PROFESSIONAL shall hold secret and confidential all information designated by PVWC as confidential. PROFESSIONAL shall not reveal any designated confidential information to a third party unless the disclosing party was lawfully possessed with the information before receipt of same from the party claiming confidentiality and whose information has been designated as described herein as being confidential, or applicable law, regulation, court order or any agency of competent jurisdiction requires its disclosure; or the failure to disclose the information would pose an imminent and substantial threat to human health or the environment.
- 10. PROFESSIONAL shall maintain insurance against the following risk during the term of this AGREEMENT:
- a) Worker's Compensation in statutory amounts and Employer's Liability for PROFESSIONAL'S employees for the PROJECT for related injuries or disease; and
- b) General Liability and Automobile Liability (each including excess coverage as required) and each in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for

personal injury or property damage to third parties which arises from PROFESSIONAL'S performance under this AGREEMENT; and

c) Professional Liability in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for legal obligations arising out of PROFESSIONAL'S fallure to meet the STANDARD OF CARE or other items covered under such Professional Liability policy.

PROFESSIONAL shall provide to the PVWC certificates of insurance as to each of the above which evidence that the policies are in effect.

- 11. This AGREEMENT shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey and any litigation/arbitration relating to the AGREEMENT shall be venued in New Jersey. In the event of litigation, the parties agree and consent to the action being initiated in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Passaic County.
- 12. PROFESSIONAL represents that it is an independent professional and not an employee of PVWC.
- 13. If a dispute or complaint arises concerning this AGREEMENT, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL will negotiate a resolution of the dispute. Should negotiations be unsuccessful, the resolution of the dispute shall be submitted to arbitration in accordance with the current Construction Industry Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association and the arbitration proceeding shall be venued in New Jersey. Any decision rendered by the arbitrators shall be final. Judgment may be entered upon the decision in any court having jurisdiction. The decision shall not be subject to modification or appeal except to the extent permitted by Sections 10 and 11 of the Federal Arbitration Act (9 U.S.C. 10, 11). Notwithstanding the aforementioned, disputes which have a total value (exclusive of interest) in excess of the dollar amount for cost of services (said dollar amount as stipulated in paragraph 3 herein) shall not be arbitrated but shall be litigated.
- 14. All notices required or intended under this AGREEMENT may be delivered in person, by facsimile or express mail. All notices shall be effective upon the date of receipt by the parties. Notices shall be delivered or sent to the other party at the address appearing in this AGREEMENT. An address may only be changed by written notice to the other party.
- 15. During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:
- The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Except with respect to affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, the contractor will ensure that equal employment opportunity is afforded to such applicants in recruitment and employment, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, Such equal employment opportunity shall include but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- b) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex.
- c) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative or workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

- d) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- e) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to afford equal employment opportunities to minority and women workers consistent with good faith efforts to meet targeted county employment goals established in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2, or Good faith efforts to meet targeted county employment goals determined by the Division, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2.
- f) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to inform in writing its appropriate recruitment agencies including, but not limited to, employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, labor unions, that it does not discriminate on the basis of age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, and that it will discontinue the use of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.
- g) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to revise any of its testing procedures, if necessary, to assure that all personal testing conforms to the principles of job-related testing, as established by the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey and as established by applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.
- h) In conforming with the applicable employment goals, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to review all procedures relating to transfer, upgrading, downgrading and layoff to ensure that all such actions are taken without regard to age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationallty or sex, consistent with the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey, and applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.
- i) The contractor shall submit to the public agency, after notification of award but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:
 - -Letter of Federal Affirmative Action Plan Approval
 - -Certificate of Employee Information Report
 - -Employee Information Report Form AA302
- j) The contractor and its subcontractor shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance as may be requested by the Division from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code at N.J.A.C. 17:27.
- 16. This AGREEMENT is subject to termination at the conclusion of all of the Contract work, time being of the essence as described herein, unless extended by the mutual agreement of the Parties. PVWC retains the right to terminate the PROFESSIONAL upon 15 days' notice to the PROFESSIONAL, which notice shall be effective when given to the PROFESSIONAL in writing at the PROFESSIONAL'S place of business by way of certified mail return receipt requested and regular mail. No other Notice shall be necessary. Should termination under this Article take place, the PROFESSIONAL shall be entitled to compensation for all authorized Contract work completed satisfactorily to the date of termination. PVWC shall be the sole judge of satisfactory work.
- 17. This AGREEMENT, including any schedules, attachments and referenced documents, is the entire agreement between PVWC and PROFESSIONAL. Any prior or contemporaneous agreements, promises, negotiations or representations not expressly stated herein are of no force and effect. Any changes to this AGREEMENT shall be in writing and signed by the PVWC and PROFESSIONAL.
- 18. A waiver or breach of any term, condition or covenant by a party shall not constitute a waiver or breach of any other term, condition or covenant. If any court of competent jurisdiction declares a provision of the AGREEMENT invalid, illegal or otherwise unenforceable, the remaining provisions of the AGREEMENT shall remain in full force and effect.

- The effective date of this AGREEMENT shall be as of the date set forth hereinabove, or where such date is not indicated, the effective date of the AGREEMENT shall be when the last of the two parties is in full possession of a fully executed AGREEMENT document.
- PROFESSIONAL'S hourly rates for technical and related support services and non-labor expenses shall be as set forth in the PROPOSAL.
- PROFESSIONAL understands and agrees that upon submission to PVWC and upon receipt of proper payment as provided for in this AGREEMENT, any reports, data, logs or other information provided to PVWC pursuant to the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT (and which are not designated in accordance with Paragraph 9 of this AGREEMENT as being confidential) are deemed to be nonproprietary to the extent that PVWC, in its sole discretion, may utilize the information submitted for whatever purposes it deems necessary or desirable without seeking permission from PROFESSIONAL, and without providing any additional compensation to PROFESSIONAL; provided, however, that PVWC shall have sole responsibility for use of such work products in applications for which they may not originally have been intended. Reports, data, logs and other information provided to PVWC by PROFESSIONAL shall become the property of PVWC provided, however, that PROFESSIONAL shall have unrestricted right to their use.
- PVWC designates the Executive Director, the Director of Engineering, or the General Counsel, of the PVWC as its designated representative having authority to give instructions, receive information, define PVWC'S policies, and make decisions with respect to the scope of the work to be performed. PVWC reserves the right to change these designees from time to time and will notify PROFESSIONAL of any change(s) in writing.
- Except as otherwise approved by PVWC, for the PROJECT, PVWC will be responsible for furnishing all approvals and permits from governmental authorities and other entities having jurisdiction over the scope of the work to be performed and approvals from others as may be necessary for the timely completion of the said work, including payment of all permit fees.
- This AGREEMENT may be executed in several counterparts and all so executed documents shall constitute one agreement, binding on all the parties hereto, notwithstanding that all the parties are not signatory to the original or the same counterpart.

Purpose of Proposal

The Passaic Valley Water Commission is seeking proposals from qualified respondents for the purpose of conducting and coordinating all activities for the search for an Executive Director.

Overview

- A. The Passaic Valley Water Commission (Commission or PVWC) owns, operates and maintains the Little Falls Water Treatment Plant, located in Totowa, NJ, as well as remote facilities, including multiple pumping stations, chemical feed stations, water storage tanks, reservoirs and dams. These facilities enable the Commission to provide potable drinking water to an equivalent population of over 750,000. The Commission also owns, operates and maintains the distribution system piping infrastructure located in Prospect Park and North Arlington as well as the three owner cities of Clifton, Paterson and Passaic and operates and maintains the distribution system of the Borough of Lodi.
- B. As a large public potable water purveyor, the Commission is committed to providing our customers with safe, high quality water and service. To achieve these goals, the Commission recognizes that assistance through the procurement of professional services provides a valuable service to the Commission.
- C. The scope of the Respondent's Proposal shall be sufficiently comprehensive and detailed to enable the Commission to review and evaluate same for viability, completeness, and consistency with the Commission's goals and objectives.

B. Questions, clarifications, and modifications that may have a substantial impact on the Proposal will be addressed in writing to all recipients of this RFP.

Responder's Proposed Form of Agreement

Responders shall submit with their proposal submission package the form of agreement they propose to enter into with the Commission. Responder hereby agrees to negotiate said form of agreement in good faith with the Commission in the event the Commission finds terms and conditions, if any, to be unacceptable. As part of the Commission's overall evaluation of proposals received, the Commission will evaluate the form of agreement submitted by the Responder.

Scope of Service

The Search consultant services shall include, but limited to the following:

1. Search Process Development

Meeting with the Commission to develop a customized search process, with appropriate measurement tools and based upon the particular needs of the Passaic Valley Water Commission.

2. Recruitment Phase Process

Developing and implementing the recruitment phase of the search which would include, preparing advertisements, receiving and processing all applications, conducting appropriate background checks, identifying all qualified candidates, conducting preliminary interviews of said qualified candidates and providing to the Commission a list of semi-finalists.

3. Interviewing and Selection of Candidates—Semi Finalists/Finalists
Work closely with the Commission, for the purpose of selecting and
interviewing candidates from a list of semifinalists. This part would also include
working with the entire Passaic Valley Water Commission for the interviewing
and selecting a candidate from the list of finalists.

4. Appointment and Transition Process

Guiding the Commission in the appointment process which would include all transitional support to the Commission with such activities as:

- a. Conducting site visits and coordinating any interviews with various stakeholders.
- Setting goals and objectives with the newly appointed Executive Director and Passaic Valley Water Commission.
- c. Providing at least one workshop with the Commission and the Executive Director for an effective evaluation system for the Executive Director.

Post Appointment Management Services--Optional



Provide to the Passaic Valley Water Commission, at an agreed upon fee, any management support including, mission statement preparation, long-range planning, leadership guidance and training, and community and public involvement with the Passaic Valley Water Commission.

Qualifications of Respondents

The Passaic Valley Water Commission prefers from each respondent, evidence that the respondent has conducted and coordinated all activities for a successful* Executive Director appointment from at a minimum, of two (2) water utilities. As used herein, the term "Executive Director" shall also include the equivalent title or position in other water utilities. It is preferred that the successful appointments were within the last five (5) years of the date of this request for proposal.

The Passaic Valley Water Commission identifies a successful appointment as one where the Executive Director remained at the water utility for at least twelve (12) consecutive months or longer.

5. Contract Period

It is the intention of the Passaic Valley Water Commission to award the contract no later than June 2021, with the goal of having an Executive Director appointed and ready to start the position as soon as possible.

6. Coordination of Activities

All activities of this contract will be coordinated by the Passaic Valley Water Commission, with administrative support from the Board Secretary's Office:

7. Fee Schedule - Payment

The Commission requests that respondents submit a one lump sum fee for all activities listed in their proposal. The Commission requests that respondents provide an additional fee for all post appointment optional management services. This is further explained in Section III—Cost Criteria.

The Commission will develop a payment plan to the consultant which will include a monthly payment for services rendered. A one final payment to the consultant will be made upon the successful candidate accepting the appointment, executing the employment contract and beginning the employment.

Failure of Candidate to Execute Contract of Employment

All respondents submitting proposals fully understand that if the candidate appointed by the Commission either fails to execute the contract or fails to begin work on the agreed upon starting date, the successful respondent shall continue the search process at no extra cost to the Passaic Valley Water Commission. The

The respondent shall submit a full description of the business organization to include, but not be limited to:

- Name, address, phone, fax, website, e-mail address and other information of the professional firm or individual;
- An organizational chart noting the names of all principals and partners;
- · Resumes of key staff members;
- Other information concerning individuals of the professional firm that would assist the Passaic Valley Water Commission in the evaluation process; and
- A description or profile of consultant, detailing the type of services (s)he will provide, and any information or materials that (s)he believes would be helpful to the Commission in making its decision, i.e., a statement of qualifications, statement of confidentiality.

B. Qualifications; Relevant Experience

Respondents shall submit documentation highlighting qualifications and experience they have that will assist the Commission in the evaluation and selection process. Such documentation shall include, but not be limited to:

- The Passaic Valley Water Commission prefers from each respondent, evidence, that the respondent has conducted and coordinated all activities for a successful* Executive Director appointment from two (2) water utilities. It is preferred that the successful appointments must be documented to be completed within the last five (5) years of the date of this request for proposal;
- The Passaic Valley Water Commission identifies a successful appointment as one where the Executive Director remained with the water utility for at least twelve (12) consecutive months or longer;
- A list of all water utilities in which the respondent has provided successful Executive Director searches and appointments;



 Letters of recommendations from two (2) water utilities in which the respondent has provided successful school Executive Director searches and appointments.

Copies of all professional or educational licenses that are required to

perform the services as listed in the specifications:

II. Technical Criteria

A. Description of Services

· Expenses Not Related to the Contract; Procedures

There may be a circumstance where a request is made for the respondent to provide services not directly related to the contract. These services not related to the contract are not to be provided by the respondent. The Commission will procure these services separately.

Extraordinary Expenses

Extraordinary expenses to be incurred by the respondent in the performance of his/her duties may be brought to the Commission prior to the actual expenditure. The Commission, upon recommendation of the appropriate administrator, may consider reimbursing the expense, or the Commission may procure the services separately.

9. Evaluation Process - Weighting and Scoring of Proposals

All RFP responses are to be evaluated on the basis of whose response is the most advantageous to Passaic Valley Water Commission, price and other factors considered, and whose response will provide the highest quality of service at fair and competitive prices.
