WHEREAS, the County of Bergen (the "County") is planning to undertake the replacement of Bergen County Bridge No. 020031B, located on Passaic Avenue over the Saddle River in the Borough of Lodi (the "Project"), and

WHEREAS, the Passaic Valley Water Commission (the "Commission") owns and operates an existing water system in the area of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Project will impact existing PVWC facilities and will require the relocation of the existing water main and protection of existing facilities that are owned and operated by the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the County will, at its sole cost and expense, contract for and cause to be constructed, all items in the County's contract plans and specifications for the Project related to the existing and proposed facilities that are owned and operated by the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Commission is desirous of entering into an Agreement allowing for the protection and relocation of it's water system in the project area; and

WHEREAS, the County has issued a Memorandum of Agreement dated May 6, 2021 (the "Agreement"), and a copy of the Agreement has been attached to a copy of the Director of Engineering's memorandum dated July 6, 2021 and are attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A; and

Bergen County Bridge No. 020031B Bergen County Project No. 1800564

This project involves the replacement of the Passaic Avenue Bridge over the Saddle River, Borough of Lodi by the County of Bergen (County).

The County issued a Memorandum of Agreement dated May 6, 2021 (the "Agreement") for the relocation of the existing water main and protection of existing facilities that are owned and operated by the Commission at the Project at the sole cost and expense of the County (see attached copy of the Agreement).

The Engineering Department has reviewed the Agreement and found it to be acceptable. The County will be incorporating PVWC's water main requirements into their contract documents.

Accordingly, it is recommended that the Commission execute the Agreement with the PVWC resolution at the next Commission meeting.

Proposed Work

The following is understood between Bergen County Engineering, the County's Engineering consultant, McLaren Technical Services, Inc. (McLaren), and PVWC:

Bergen County's selected contractor (the Contractor) shall be responsible for the
installation of a new 12-inch DIP main as shown on Sheet 1 of 3 of the enclosed
coordination drawings entitled PVWC Water Main Relocation Plan, prepared by McLaren.
The utility work shall proceed in accordance with the provisions set forth below at no cost
to PVWC.

Related Utility Work

The Contractor will complete the following related utility work in conjunction with the bridge construction and water main installation:

- 1. Reset water valve castings to the new roadway grade.
- Remove and/or abandon water mains once the new water main has been placed into service.

The following is also understood:

- The Contractor shall be responsible for furnishing and installing all materials required to replace the existing water main as described herein and as described in the Contract Documents.
- 4. Required easements and NJDEP project permits shall be secured by Bergen County.
- PVWC requires 48-hour notice before any water main installation to allow them the opportunity to be present to conduct any required inspections.
- Tie-ins to the existing main shall be performed by the Contractor. The tie-in points, which were identified and approved by PVWC, shall be confirmed with test pits excavated by the Contractor.
- 7. PVWC requires at least 7 days' notice prior to the planned date for the tie-in to the existing main on each side of the bridge to make arrangements for shut down of the main and to coordinate public notification.
- 8. PVWC shall be responsible for inspection of the water main installation work at no cost to Bergen County and/or the Contractor.
- PVWC shall comply with the project schedule and coordinate with the Contractor to accomplish inspections of the water main installation work as quickly as possible.
- The Contractor shall comply with all PVWC construction requirements including disinfection and testing of the new main.
- 11. The Contractor shall comply with PVWC materials standards and provide cut sheets to PVWC for approval prior to construction.

12. PVWC shall supply all applicable standards requested by McLaren, Bergen County, and/or the Contractor.

EXHIBIT A

We make this certification to Gregg Lucianin, Purchasing Agent, for the procurement of a mass spectrometer for lead and copper testing.

- Passaic Valley Water Commission (PVWC) services the owner cities of Paterson, Passaic, Clifton and Prospect Park. PVWC also serves Lodi, North Arlington and parts of West Milford.
- Testing for various parameters within our drinking water system is required by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the Environmental Protection Agency.
- Advantages to ICP-MS include the favorable detection limits (0.01 to 0.1 µg/L for many elements), simple specimen preparation, high throughput, and the ability to measure more than one element simultaneously.
- ICP-MS will allow for quicker, more streamlined, and low-level detection of primary and secondary contaminants in drinking water including aluminum, antimony, arsenic, barium, beryllium, cadmium, chromium, cobalt, copper, lead, manganese, mercury, molybdenum, nickel, selenium, silver, thallium, thorium, uranium, vanadium, and zinc.
- The laboratory's primary focus will be on lead and copper analysis. Currently, PVWC ships all lead and copper testing samples, which includes numerous clients, to Brick MUA for testing.
- Sending out samples for testing increases the sample turn around time and incurs costs related to packaging, mailing, chain of custody and actual sampling.
- Upcoming changes to the Lead and Copper rule will result in increased sampling frequency and volume. Water providers will be required to sample at schools and childcare facilities including in-home daycares. This will dramatically increase the number of samples PVWC and its clients collect and analyze. Additionally, under the Find-and-Fix provision water systems are required to collect a follow-up sample for each tap sample site that exceeded 15 μg/L within 30 days of receiving the tap sample result.
- There are two mass spectrometers currently under State Contract; PerkinElmer and Agilent Technologies.
- The cost for the Perkin Elmer is approximately \$10,000 more than the cost for the Agilent at a price of \$147,983.78.
- In our opinion, these two manufacturers are the top performers for this type of equipment.
- Based upon our experience with various laboratory equipment manufacturers, PerkinElmer has a
 proven track record of lower maintenance issues and a more user-friendly interface, and, therefore,
 less down time, higher productivity for equipment use, and greater potential for cross-training
 staff.

I. Background

It is a pleasure for Westin Technology Solutions, LLC ("Westin') to submit this proposal to the Passaic Valley Water Commission ("PVWC" or "Commission"). Westin is currently under contract with the Commission for providing professional services in the Competitive Contracting Procurement of a New CMMS System. Westin has previously completed a Best Practices Review for the Commission's customer management program as well as its maintenance and infrastructure management program.

This proposal would continue Westin's services to conduct a best practices assessment for the Commission's Human Resources ("HR") Department. The project goal is to objectively evaluate the Commission's HR organization, existing services and related business practices. The Westin team will conduct a comprehensive study of the Department's current organizational structure, roles and responsibilities, levels of service, and operational functions against best industry practices and in alignment with the Commission's business goals. Based on the gap assessment against best practices, Westin will make a series of practical recommendations for improvement. The result of Westin's assessment efforts will be an objective, unbiased assessment of the Department with specific recommendations for enhancement.

Project Kickoff Meeting - We will begin by facilitating a Project Kickoff Meeting with the Commission's Project Manager and other select staff to introduce the Westin project team members, present the overall project approach and schedule, set the level of Commission involvement, and discuss the project logistics and deliverables. At this meeting, we will request a set of documents for our initial review, determine the key interviewees, schedule any on-site activities, discuss any initial areas of concern, and answer any questions. This initial Project Kickoff Meeting is envisioned to last approximately 1 ½ hours.

Document Reviews – Westin will also request a series of documents for our review prior to beginning any on-site activities. Requested documents are envisioned to include:

- Current Organizational Chart w/ identified vacancies

Interviews – Once the documents have been received and understood by the Westin team, we will conduct one-on-one interviews with select Commission personnel to gather additional details regarding the vision, current performance, employee service levels, and the existing culture of the Department. Westin envisions from 8 to 10 individual interviews with knowledgeable Commission personnel. These interviews will be designed to efficiently gather the requisite information using an open, interactive dialog approach. Each interview is expected to be in-person and last from 45 – 60 minutes. All specific discussions during the interviews will be confidential within Westin. Individual comments will not be attributed to any specific Commission employee. Westin's policy of strict confidentiality allows for open and honest discussions that produce the input necessary to make well-supported recommendations.

Organizational Survey – To efficiently gather additional current state information, Westin will employ a web-based survey instrument using Survey Monkey or similar tool. The goal is to cost-effectively elicit broader perceptions from the Commission's employees. We have several relevant organizational questionnaires and will modify the survey questions depending on the initial findings from the document reviews and interviews for more meaningful survey results.

Findings Evaluation – Based on the above activities, Westin will then compare our findings and observations against best practices to identify the current successes, as well as any significant areas for improvement. Westin will continue documenting the Department's baseline performance and begin to identify practical strategies and actions for improvements. During this effort, we will work with closely with the Commission's Project Manager to clarify any information gaps needed to complete our evaluation.

Validation Workshop – Upon completion of the document reviews, interviews and workshops, Westin will facilitate a Validation Meeting with the Commission's Project Manager and other select management personnel to review our findings for factual accuracy. During this workshop, Westin will also present potential quick wins and the identified opportunities for mid-term and long-term organizational

improvement. Any gaps or ambiguities in the information assessed will be resolved through subsequent discussions with the PVWC Project Manager, records review, interviews, and/or additional on-site efforts.

Draft Assessment Report - After successful completion of the Validation Meeting, Westin will develop and deliver a Draft Assessment Report. The Draft Assessment Report will contain:

- An accurate, validated "as-is" assessment of the Commission HR Department's organizational and operational performance against best practices;
- > A list of potential "quick wins" that the Commission can implement in the near term; and

Executive Presentation - Westin will present the results and recommendations from the Draft Assessment Report to the Commission's executive management team. Summary

It is recommended that, under Project 19-P-89, Westin Technology Solutions, LLC ("Westin") of Milwaukee, Wisconsin be awarded an increase of \$29,250.00, increasing their total not-to-exceed amount to \$923,245.00 to provide PVWC with additional professional services related to the Project as set forth in the attached copy of Westin's proposal dated June 29, 2021.

These recommended modifications are set forth in more detail below.

Background

Westin is currently under contract to assist the PVWC for Professional Services in Competitive Contracting Procurement of a New CMMS System. The ultimate goal is to successfully replace PVWC's existing work order systems with a modern computerized maintenance management system ("CMMS") solution that will assist the Commission to better manage its infrastructure assets, add workforce efficiency, improve asset data quality, and more effective and efficient reporting.

The Project was awarded to Westin in accordance with the authorized scope of work, and with reimbursement to be on a time-and-materials basis, not to exceed \$558,920.00. The previously approved Change Order No. 1 increased the Contract Price by \$335,075.00 for Implementation Assistance and Post-Implementation Refinement.

At PVWC's request, Westin has submitted a proposal dated June 29, 2021 (the "Proposal") to modify the Project to include performing an optimization assessment of PVWC's Human Resources Department. A copy of the Proposal, including a description of the said additional services along with a breakdown of the scope and additional costs related thereto, is attached hereto.

Westin's Proposal appears to be reasonable, considering the nature and scope of additional Work involved, and it is recommended that the said changes to the Project, and additional costs related thereto, be approved. The additional services to be rendered pursuant hereto constitute professional services (or extraordinary unspecifiable services) within the meaning and intent of the Local Public Contracts Law.

Change Order No. 2 would increase the not-to-exceed total price for the Project by \$29,250.00 for a revised not-to-exceed total price of \$923,245.00.

Subject to concurrence and approval by the Law Department, the said changes will be incorporated into an Amendment to Agreement for the Project, the form of which is attached hereto.
