CONTINUOUS MONITORING FOR TOTAL CHLOROPHYLL-a, PHYCOCYANIN, AND TURBIDITY AT PASSAIC RIVER BELOW TWO BRIDGES, NEW JERSEY

Problem

Demands on water resources in New Jersey require the availability of high-quality water for multiple uses. Numerous sources of pollution have deteriorated the quality of water resources within the State. Water resources planning must address these and other problems to ensure a water supply of high quality to meet future water needs. To assist in the management of these resources, continuous monitoring of water-quality conditions provides the necessary information on the quality of water resources. Continuous monitoring of turbidity, chlorophyll-a, and phycocyanin in combination with existing continuous monitoring of dissolved oxygen and pH improve the identification of algal blooms, which, in turn, lead to degraded water quality downstream of the monitoring location. When the algal biomass is too great, the health of other aquatic biota may be adversely affected. Excessive algae concentrations of certain classes, such as blue-green, also create taste, odor, and water clarity issues for the production of drinking water. Water resource managers, when made aware of incipient algal blooms, may change or blend the source waters to obtain optimal water quality for water treatment.

Objective and Scope

To provide a continuous record of turbidity, chlorophyll-a, and phycocyanin concentrations in the Passaic River downstream from the confluence with the Pompton River at Two Bridges, New Jersey. The status of turbidity, chlorophyll-a as a measure of phytoplankton biomass, and phycocyanin concentrations will be monitored for the purpose of planning and managing water resources in the Passaic River.

Approach

Concentrations of turbidity, total chlorophyll-a, and phycocyanin will be measured hourly on the Passaic River downstream from the confluence with the Pompton River using the monitoring station at Two Bridges, New Jersey. Turbidity and chlorophyll-a/phycocyanin sensors will be operated at the existing monitoring station. The sensors will be operated and maintained to record chlorophyll-a and phycocyanin concentrations hourly from two locations and turbidity at 3 locations along a cross section of the river for the period October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022.

Water samples will be collected during every routine inspection (approximately every 6 weeks), every fouling check (approximately every 3 weeks between routine inspections), and up to an additional 6 times per year depending on conditions for a total of 24 samples per year per intake. Chlorophyll-a samples will be sent to the USGS National Water Quality Laboratory (NWQL) for analysis of total chlorophyll-a and total Pheophytin-a. Phycocyanin samples will be analyzed by BSA Environmental Services for analysis of phycocyanin through NWQL contract. The laboratory analyses will be compared to the continuous monitor data to determine if the chlorophyll and phycocyanin measurements from the chlorophyll-a/phycocyanin sensor correlate with the lab analyses. The equipment will be calibrated as needed to minimize the difference between the laboratory results and the monitor readings.

Operation and Maintenance

The United States Geological Survey (USGS) New Jersey Water Science Center will continue to operate and maintain the following gages as detailed in the table below for the Passaic Valley Water Commission (PVWC).

FORM OF AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SECURITY SERVICES

This Agreement (hereinafter the "Agreement"), made and entered into as of this day of ______, 20___, by and between Passaic Valley Water Commission, (hereinafter "PVWC") having offices at 1525 Main Avenue, Clifton, New Jersey 07011 and Universal Protection Service, LLC d/b/a Allied Universal Security Services having offices at 1100 Valley Brook Avenue, Suite 201, Lyndhurst, New Jersey 07071 (hereinafter "Professional") is for Project 21-P-87 "Professional Security Services" for the provision of security-related services associated with PVWC's security programs (hereinafter "Services").

WHEREAS, PVWC desires to contract with the Professional for the provision of Services by specially assigned Professional's Employees to provide regular patrol and other Services with respect to PVWC's operations at its various facilities in order to enhance the safety and protection of PVWC's employees, agents, vendors, members of the general public and others; and

WHEREAS, the Services are separate and apart, and in addition to, any such other services that may be provided by the Professional to other residents, taxpayers and citizens, and separate and apart, and in addition to, that which is provided by the municipalities in which PVWC's facilities are located; and

WHEREAS, the program objective is for the Professional's Office to provide comprehensive, quality security to all PVWC employees, properties, and facilities through both active/physical checks and passive surveillance, alarm monitoring, and methods and other appropriate means; and

WHEREAS, to accomplish this, there will be manpower deployment for twenty-four (24) hour coverage, seven (7) days a week throughout the term of the Agreement;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that PVWC and the Professional agree, as follows:

1. Staffing

In order to provide the essential Services required by PVWC, an armed Professional's Employees (armed retired police or retired military personnel with an open-carry permit) shall be assigned 24/7 to patrol PVWC properties. Additionally, an armed Professional's Employee shall be assigned from 10am to 10pm to patrol PVWC properties. These personnel will be provided Sunday through Saturday. Professional's Employees assigned to Patrol will be available for security checks and will respond to calls to PVWC properties.

These personnel shall be able to pass background and criminal history checks as well as periodic drug tests to the extent permissible under applicable law. Their activities will be monitored and supervised by the Professional's Patrol Supervisor.

The Professional shall provide supervision of the Professional's Employees and all equipment and materials necessary to perform security duties and crime prevention at all PVWC facilities in accordance herewith.

PVWC may decline an assigned Professional's Employee, based on competent evidence, which has been presented to the Professional's Office, and substantiated through an investigation, that the Employee has not met PVWC's reasonable performance expectations. The Professional will take the concerns of PVWC and its management under consideration, concerning the staffing of Employees, but he retains the final right of assignment, which shall be reasonably exercised in the context of this Agreement.

To ensure continuity of effective service, the Professional's Office will identify Professional's Employees to be assigned on a steady basis. These Employees will receive training specific to problems encountered at PVWC's facilities. Periodic training needs will be identified and coordinated with PVWC. It is hereby agreed that there will be periodic rotation of Professional's Employees in accordance with the Professional's Office established policies.

2. Deployment

Assigned Professional's Employees will constantly patrol the grounds, both inside and out, of all the structures and including perimeter patrols at the main plant, as well as PVWC's other properties and facilities.

One of the patrol personnel may be assigned to man the guardhouse located at the Union Ave entrance to the main treatment plant on an as needed basis. This Security Guard will be responsible for monitoring all incoming and out-going traffic at the plant. The Security Guard will issue temporary ID's to visitors as well as monitor the security cameras, and will also maintain daily logs of all property/facility checks, all incoming calls received at the guardhouse and all the visitors and deliveries to the plant.

One of the patrol personnel shall be assigned to man the billing counter located at the 1525 Main Avenue entrance from 4:30 to 6:30 pm.

The Professional's Patrol Supervisor shall ensure a coordinated effort is maintained, encompassing the personnel assigned to patrol PVWC properties.

Personnel coverage shall not be diminished for vacations or other time off of the assigned personnel, rather whenever necessary to ensure the indicated minimum coverage, the Professional Patrol Supervisor shall assign additional Professional's Employees to cover the post(s).

3. Term

The Term of the Agreement shall be for a period of twelve (12) months, commencing as of the day and year first written above, or as otherwise agreed upon in writing by the Parties, or the date on which this Agreement has been signed and fully executed by both Parties, whichever is later.

4. <u>Communications</u>

- A. The Professional agrees that PVWC will have unrestricted access to all information which in any way deals with criminal activity in any of the PVWC's facilities to the extent permitted by law. It is further agreed that the Professional's Office will provide to the PVWC, to the extent permissible by law, copies of such incident reports, arrest reports (if applicable) or other documents which document or substantiate actual or potential criminal activity in or connected with the facilities or activities or business of PVWC. This information will be provided at no cost by the Professional's Office on a regular basis.
- B. Reporting: The Professional's Office will maintain data regarding calls for service, property/facility checks, incidents, arrests (if applicable) or criminal investigations and other pertinent information. This information shall be presented by the Professional to PVWC's designated representative when requested.
- C. Forms: The Professional's Office will require all Professional's Employees to complete a daily log of each shift. This report will include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - 1. Hours worked: foot, bicycle, motorized, other
 - 2. Calls/requests for service
 - 3. Referrals to others/agencies, etc.
 - 4. Suspicious person's name and description
 - 5. Vehicles abandoned/towed/stolen
 - 6. Drug paraphernalia confiscated/found
 - 7. Arrests/citations of both employees and outsiders to include appropriate information
 - 8. Property recovered/stolen
 - 9. Broken/vandalized equipment, evidence of broken entryways, windows, etc.
 - 10. Graffiti
 - 11. Conflict resolution; e.g., resolved apparent or actual conflict between two or more people
 - 12. Vehicle license number of suspicious person
 - 13. Weapons violations/seized
 - 14. Other suspicious or noteworthy activity in the Security context

D. Media Coordination: The Professional's Office will relay to PVWC's Executive Director or his designee information related to major crime or incident of note that occurs on PVWC property or relating to PVWC's conduct of business, before the media is informed if the media is informed, at all. And release of information to the public and the press shall be coordinated between PVWC's Executive Director and the Professional to the extent possible and permissible in accordance with applicable law.

5. Methods and Management

The Professional agrees that the Professional's Office will employ policing concepts appropriate to PVWC's facilities and operations in consultation with PVWC's Management.

The Professional agrees that with respect to the services to be performed by any Professional's Office personnel in accordance with this Agreement, the appropriate Professional's Office Patrol Commander or Supervisor will meet with PVWC and management representatives, if required, for the purposes of reviewing the enforcement and prevention efforts and planning for future changes or modifications anticipated by this Agreement.

The Professional and PVWC acknowledge that the Professional's written rules and regulations (hereinafter the "Manual") exist to regulate Professional Employees' conduct and activities. All Professional's Employees shall have been properly trained in this regard. The Professional hereby represents that each of the Professional's Employees has tendered to the Professional a signed receipt from each Employee that he/she has received and understands the contents of the Manual, and that the Professional's Employees have been adequately trained on the regulations and orders within the Manual.

The Professional's Office shall designate a supervisory Employee, who shall be dedicated to supervision of the Professional's Employees and personnel and/or any liaison assigned to the PVWC operation. The Professional's supervisory Employee will work in concert with the Executive Director of PVWC or his designee.

The Professional's supervisory Employee shall be responsible for the following duties:

Coordinate the dissemination and processing of security reports, provide supervisory assistance and coordinate the resolution of problems.

Establish a clearly defined process for reporting non-emergency criminal activities.

6. Additional Duties

It is further agreed that to the extent necessary, the Professional's Employees will appear as witnesses in PVWC's administrative grievance procedures, civil hearings, or other civil or court proceedings where the issue includes criminal or quasi-criminal or other conduct involving potential liability or disciplinary action in or near PVWC's facilities or in connection with or in the course of carrying out their duties hereunder.

The Professional's Employees shall fully participate in civil action proceedings brought by or against PVWC, which are based upon arrests, if applicable, or incidents in which they are involved or about which they have relevant information. Such participation shall include but not be limited to obtaining copies of police reports, lab results, investigation reports (subject to review and approval of the appropriate governmental agency), consulting with the PVWC's representative and attorney, and testifying in court or administrative law or similar proceedings.

7. Equipment and Vehicles

The Professional agrees that it will provide the Professional's Employees with such basic equipment and vehicles as may be necessary and reasonable in order to allow the Professional's Employees to carry out the duties anticipated under this Agreement. The Professional shall be responsible for the repairs and maintenance of the Professional's equipment and vehicles utilized on site, which equipment and vehicles shall be, and shall remain, the property of the Professional.

In order to implement this program, not less than two (2) marked patrol units shall be provided by Professional. At a minimum, each unit shall be equipped by Professional with oxygen, defibrillator, first aid kit, road safety, water rescue

equipment, and any other equipment deemed necessary by professional to provide the required and intended services.

Units should be (4) wheel drive, high clearance type vehicles.

Other required equipment that shall be provided by Professional shall include, without implied limitation, a base radio at PVWC's guardhouse, portable radios with chargers and individual Professional Employee's safety gear such as masks, helmets, vests, sticks and weapons.

Initially, monitoring of security cameras will be possible in PVWC's guardhouse. It will be the responsibility of the Security Guard there to monitor the cameras.

8. Supervision and Compensation

The Professional, through the Professional's Office, shall at all times provide supervision, control and direction of work activities and assignments of patrol personnel, including disciplinary action. It is expressly understood that the Professional shall be responsible for the compensation of the Professional's Employees and all employee benefits, including worker's compensation insurance, as well as any injury to Employees, their property or the Professional's property.

9. <u>Indemnification</u>

The Professional shall indemnify, defend and save and hold harmless PVWC and their officers, agents and employees, and each and every one of them (the "Indemnities") from and against any damage, liability, loss, costs (including but not limited to attorneys' fees and court and arbitration costs) or claims to the extent caused by the negligent performance or nonperformance of the work provided for under this Contract.

This indemnification shall apply to damages, liabilities, losses, costs and claims arising from the negligence of the Indemnities, but shall not apply to damages, liabilities, losses, costs or claims to the extent caused by the negligence of the Indemnities.

The Professional's indemnification obligation shall not be limited by the amount of insurance required to be carried by the Professional under this Contract.

These indemnifications are intended to provide the broadest indemnification permitted by law and shall be construed consistent with all applicable laws of the State of New Jersey, including but not limited to the laws pertaining to indemnification.

10. <u>Insurance Requirements</u>

The Professional acknowledges that PVWC has an insurable interest relative to the scope of services rendered by the Professional under this Contract.

The Professional is required to submit evidence (consisting of Certificates of Insurance and copies of the insurance policies with all endorsements) satisfactory to PVWC showing that the Professional has obtained all insurance coverage as required herein. The Professional is not permitted to enter the premises of PVWC or to perform any work under this Contract unless all of the insurance required by this Contract is in effect.

Nothing contained in this Article shall be construed as limiting the extent of the Professional's liability for claims or damages resulting from or related to the Professional's services performed under this Contract.

All insurance required hereunder shall include the interests of PVWC. The Professional waives all rights against PVWC and all parties named as additional insured's in such policies for all losses and damages caused by any of the perils covered by such policies and all such policies shall contain provisions to the effect that in the event of payment of any loss for damage, the insurer will have no rights of recovery against any of the parties named as additional insured's.

The Professional shall not commence any work under this Contract until the Professional has obtained, at the Professional's own expense, all insurance as set forth in this Article and has delivered Certificates of Insurance and copies of the required insurance policies with all required endorsements and indemnifications to PVWC. PVWC shall be included as an additional insured on the Professional's insurance policies (except for Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability

policies) to the extent of the Professional's indemnification obligations under this Agreement and up to the required insurance coverage amount.

The Professional shall purchase and maintain, at its sole expense, insurance that will provide protection from claims and liabilities, which may arise out of or result from the Professional's performance and furnishing services and other obligations under this Contract, whether it is to be performed or furnished by the Professional, by any of the Professional's employees, by anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them to perform or furnish services, or by anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable with companies satisfactory to PVWC as follows:

Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance: covering all of the Professional's employees directly or indirectly engaged in the performance of this Contract. This insurance shall comply with the statutory requirements of the State of New Jersey and shall have an Employer's Liability Insurance limit of not less than \$1 million for bodily injury by accident, \$1 million for occupational disease and \$1 million aggregate limit.

Commercial General Liability Insurance: with a limit of not less than \$2 million combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage. The Commercial General Liability Insurance shall include the Broad Form Property Damage Liability Endorsement as well as coverage for explosion, collapse and underground (XCU) hazards and completed operations and product liability coverage, as well as Professional Liability Coverage in the amount of \$1 million per occurrence / \$2 million aggregate. Blanket Contractual Liability Insurance must be included, expressly insuring the Professional's liability for occurrences assumed by the Professional under the indemnification clause of the Contract to the extent covered by the standard form Commercial General Liability policy in New Jersey (Broad Form with Blanket Contractual Liability Endorsement).

<u>Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance</u>: covering the Professional for claims arising from all owned, hired and non-owned vehicles with a limit of not less than \$1 million combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage.

<u>Umbrella Liability Insurance</u>: providing coverage at least as broad as that provided by the Commercial General Liability Insurance and Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance required above, with a limit of not less than \$10 million combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage and in addition thereto, Professional Liability coverage at the \$10 million limit.

Policy Limits: specified above are minimums, and wherever the law requires higher limits, the higher limits shall govern.

Forms of Policies: all liability insurance shall be on an occurrence basis.

11. <u>Termination</u>

PVWC may terminate this Contract upon the provision of one hundred twenty (120) days written notice to the Professional. Such notice shall be delivered by Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested to the address specified in this Agreement.

The Professional may terminate this Contract upon the provision of one hundred twenty (120) days written notice to PVWC. Such notice shall be delivered by Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested to the address specified in this Agreement.

12. Applicable Law

This Agreement is made and entered into in the County of Passaic, State of New Jersey. Any and all questions of law arising hereunder shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey, and venue and jurisdiction shall lie in the County of Passaic, unless otherwise agreed to by consent of both Parties and in accordance with applicable law.

13. The Agreement

The Agreement shall be deemed the entire Agreement between the Parties and shall consist of all component parts of the original RFP.

Any subsequent written addenda agreed to, signed and executed by both Parties.

14. <u>Amendments</u>

This Agreement may only be amended by a written document duly authorized by their respective governing bodies and properly executed and attested by the authorized officers of both Parties.

WHEREAS, under Contract 19-B-18 "Trench Spoils, Asphalt and Concrete Removal and Disposal Services" (the "Contract"), JR Haftek Co., Inc. of Paterson, New Jersey (the "Contractor") provided, and continues to provide, goods and services under this 2-year contract with the Passaic Valley Water Commission ("PVWC") consistently and reliably and effectively and efficiently on an as-needed basis with the Contract commencing November 18, 2019; and

WHEREAS, under the Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. as amended April 17, 2000 (the "Act"), certain discretionary provisions enabled under said Act, including extensions to existing contracts pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-15 (16) (the "LCPL"), were subsequently adopted by PVWC; and



THIS SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT (herein called the "Agreement") is made as of this _____ day of _____, 20___ by and between Passaic Valley Water Commission, a public body of the State of New Jersey, corporate and politic created pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:62-108 to 40:62-150.2 and having its principal office located at 1525 Main Avenue, Clifton, New Jersey 07011, hereinafter referred to as "PVWC", and the Borough of Lodi with its principal offices located at 1 Memorial Drive, Lodi, New Jersey 07644, which borough is a Municipal Corporation of the State of New Jersey, hereinafter referred to as "LODI" (PVWC and LODI are also individually referred to herein as "Party" and collectively as "Parties").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, PVWC operates a system of water distribution including, inter alia within the geographic limits of the Borough of Lodi and provides water to the Customers within the borough; and

WHEREAS, the PVWC desires to enter into an agreement with the Borough of Lodi (herein "LODI") to resurface various roads within the borough; and

WHEREAS, PVWC installed over 4,200 linear feet of water main in Lodi on Marion Pepe Drive, Mary Street, Logan Place and Norwood Avenue under Contract 20-B-35; and

WHEREAS, PVWC is responsible for the maintenance (including resurfacing) of any capital improvement utility road openings and LODI is responsible for the maintenance (including resurfacing) all local municipal roadways within the borough; and

WHEREAS, PVWC and LODI wish to utilize D&L Paving's contract with PVWC to jointly complete the asphalt roadway resurfacing on each entity's responsibility of the roadways for maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, PVWC and Lodi agree that the limits of this joint curb-to-curb road resurfacing project is defined by extents of the PVWC Contract 20-B-35 capital improvement project; and

WHEREAS, The work shall include excavation (milling) of 2 inches of existing asphalt, 2 inches of top paving and restoration of any line striping; and

WHEREAS, PVWC and LODI have mutually agreed to enter into the Agreement for the Project (as specified herein), where the costs of the milling, paving and roadway striping shall be split 55% / 45% by PVWC and LODI respectively, based on the area of disturbance associated with PVWC's water main replacement contract and shall include all other agreed upon costs of the project which has been estimate to be \$550,000; and

WHEREAS, upon presentation of a bill or voucher by PVWC, LODI agrees to reimburse PVWC within 30 days, for the documented quantities for the milling and paving of the roadways specified in said Agreement. The unit costs for reimbursement shall be the unit prices from the PVWC Contract 20-B-17; and

WHEREAS, PVWC and LODI will adopt reciprocal Resolutions authorizing the sharing of the cost for the work; and

WHEREAS, the agreement is authorized under the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, of the Laws of 2007, Chapter 63, effective April 3, 2007 (the "Act") N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 through 40A:65-35, as amended;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises, agreements and covenants hereinafter set forth and mutually agreed to, PVWC and LODI, each for itself, its successors and assigns, if any, do mutually covenant, promise and agree as follows:

ARTICLE I DEFINITIONS

SECTION 101 Definitions

The following definitions shall apply to and are used in this Agreement:

- "Agreement" shall mean the agreement by and between LODI and PVWC, and any and all modifications, alterations, amendments and supplements hereto which may be made by mutual agreement of the Parties.
- "Effective Date of the Agreement" shall mean the day and year first written above, or the date on which this Agreement has been signed and fully "Effective Date of the Agreement" shall mean the day and year first written above, or the date on which this Agreement has been signed and fully executed by both Parties, pursuant to their respective governing bodies duly adopted resolutions, whichever is later.
- "Event of Force Majeure" shall include, but not be limited to, the following acts, events or conditions or any combination thereof, provided however, that such act, event or condition shall be one that has or is reasonably expected to have a material adverse effect on the ability of any Party to wholly or partially perform its obligations under this Agreement, and shall be beyond the reasonable control of the Party relying thereon as justification for not performing an obligation or complying with any condition required of such Party under the terms of this Agreement. These shall include, but not be limited to:
 - a) an act of God, lightning, earthquake, hurricane, war, blockade, insurrection, riot or civil disturbance, acts of any public enemy, act of terrorism, extortion, sabotage or similar occurrence or any exercise of the power of eminent domain, arrests, police power, condemnation or other taking by or on behalf of any public, quasi-public or private entity; or
 - b) a landslide, fire, accident, strike or labor dispute, curtailment of supply or unavailability of construction materials, replacement equipment or fuel, disruption of transportation activities, failure of, or accidents to, machinery, pipelines, dams or canals, partial or entire failure of water supply, explosion, flood or nuclear radiation not created by an act or omission of either Party; or
 - c) a change in law or any curtailment, law, rule, order, regulation or restriction imposed or enacted or interpreted by governmental body after the Effective Date of the Agreement ("Change in Law"); or
 - d) an order, judgment, action and/or determination of any federal, state or local court, administrative agency, or governmental body with appropriate jurisdiction, impeding the construction, operation or maintenance of the system, provided, however, that the contesting of any such order, judgment, action and/or determination, in good faith, shall not constitute or be construed as an action or inaction within the control of such Party.
 - e) A Party's inability to perform due solely to financial circumstances unrelated to any of the foregoing shall in no case constitute an "Event of Force Majeure".

"Term of the Agreement" (also referred to herein as "Term") shall mean the Term of the Agreement as set forth in Article III of this Agreement.

"Water System" (Also referred to herein as "System") shall mean PVWC's interest in all the personality, equipment, vehicles, stock, tools,

materials and consumables, as well as all of the real estate, easements, buildings, structures and appurtenances and interest therein owned, leased or otherwise held by PVWC in connection with the supply, transmission and/or distribution of water to users of the Water System located in the geographical boundaries of LODI.

SECTION 102 Miscellaneous

Whenever the context may require, any pronoun that is used in this Agreement shall include the corresponding masculine, feminine and neuter forms, and the singular shall include the plural and vice versa. Unless otherwise noted, the words "include", "includes" and "including" when used in this Agreement shall be deemed to be followed by the phrase "without limitation". The words "agree", "agreements", "approval" and "consent" when used in this Agreement shall be deemed to be followed by the phrase "which shall not be unreasonably withheld or unduly delayed", unless the context specifies otherwise. Any consent or approval required of one of the Parties may be given by an authorized representative of that same Party and any notice or document required to be delivered to one of the Parties shall be delivered to an authorized representative of that same Party. All references to Articles, Sections, and Schedules shall, unless the context specifies otherwise, refer to this Agreement.

ARTICLE II SCOPE OF SERVICES

SECTION 201 Services

PVWC installed over 4,200 linear feet of water main in Lodi on Marion Pepe Drive, Mary Street, Logan Place and Norwood Avenue under Contract 20-B-35.

PVWC is responsible for the maintenance (including resurfacing) of any capital improvement utility road openings and LODI is responsible for the maintenance (including resurfacing) all local municipal roadways within the borough.

D&L Paving Contractors, Inc. (D&L Paving) currently has the roadway pavement restoration contract with PVWC under Contract 20-B-17.

PVWC plans to utilize D&L Paving's contract to resurface the utility trenches on the Lodi roadways where PVWC performed capital improvements under Contract 20-B-35.

LODI has determined that resurfacing improvements are warranted on Marion Pepe Drive, Mary Street, Logan Place and Norwood Avenue.

PVWC and LODI wish to utilize D&L Paving's contract with PVWC to jointly complete the asphalt roadway resurfacing on each entity's responsibility of the roadways for maintenance purposes.

The costs of the milling, paving and roadway striping shall be split 55% / 45% by PVWC and LODI respectively, based on the area of disturbance associated with PVWC's water main replacement contract and shall include all other agreed upon project costs which total is estimated to be \$550,000 subject to final calculation based upon quantity and other agreed upon project costs as reasonably determined by Thomas Solfaro of Neglia Engineering Associates, Borough Engineer for the Borough of Lodi and subject to final approval by Patrick Porcaro, Director of Engineering of the Passaic Valley Water Commission.

ARTICLE III AFFIRMATIVE ACTION REQUIREMENTS

SECTION 301 Affirmative Action

During the Term of the Agreement, each Party shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, sex, affectional or sexual orientation. Each Party shall take affirmative action to ensure that such applicants are recruited and employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, sex, affectional or sexual orientation. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. Each Party shall post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the said Party setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

- 1. Each Party shall, where applicable, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, sex, affectional or sexual orientation.
- 2. Each Party shall, where applicable, send to each labor union or representative or workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the said Party advising the labor union or workers' representative of the said Party's commitments under the law and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- 3. Each Party shall comply with the regulations promulgated by the State Treasurer pursuant to P.L. 1975, c.127, as such regulations were in effect on October 1, 1998 and to any other regulations promulgated by the State of New Jersey during the Term of this Agreement and the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- 4. Each Party shall attempt in good faith to employ minority and female workers consistent with the applicable employment goals prescribed by N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2, or later revisions thereto, as promulgated by the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey pursuant to P.L. 1975, c.127, as amended and supplemented from time to time or in accordance with a binding determination of the applicable county employment goals determined by the Affirmation Action Office pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2, or later revision thereto, as promulgated by the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey pursuant to P.L. 1975, c.127, as amended and supplemented from time to time.
- 5. Each Party shall inform in writing, appropriate recruitment agencies in the area, including employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, and labor unions, that it does not discriminate on the basis of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, sex, affectional or sexual orientation, and that it will discontinue the use of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.
- 6. Each Party shall revise its testing procedures, if necessary, to assure that all personnel testing conforms with the principles of job-related testing, as established by the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey and as established by Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.
- 7. Each Party shall review all procedures related to transfer, upgrading, downgrading and layoff to ensure that all such actions are taken without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, sex, affectional or sexual orientation, and conform with the applicable employment goals consistent with the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey, and applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.

SECTION 302 <u>Incorporation of Legal Requirements</u>

In the event that any contractual provisions which are required by law have been omitted, or in the event that this Agreement fails to properly incorporate the Affirmative Action Requirements of State law, then this Agreement shall be deemed to incorporate all such clauses by reference and such requirements shall become a part of this Agreement.

ARTICLE IV INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

SECTION 401 Comprehensive General Liability Insurance

During the Term of this Agreement, PVWC's Contractor shall provide and maintain, at its cost and expense, Comprehensive General Liability Insurance on an occurrence basis, as will protect LODI and their employees, subcontractors, and agents from claims for damages from bodily injury, including accidental death, as well as for claims for property damage, and contractual liability, which may arise from operations under this Agreement, whether such operations be by PVWC's Contractor, or any subcontractor or agent or anyone directly or indirectly employed by PVWC, or any and all of the subcontractors. The policy limits for such insurance shall be not less than \$1,000,000. The policy shall include provisions for thirty (30) day written notice to the Parties of cancellation and/or modification of coverage with respect to such policy. Policy limits may be supplemented by an excess liability policy of an umbrella form. The Parties may provide for the coverage required in this Section

through commercially available insurance or through self-insurance or joint insurance pools.

SECTION 402 Automobile Liability Insurance

During the Term of this Agreement, the Parties shall, at their own cost and expense, procure and maintain Automobile Liability Insurance, if applicable, to cover each automobile, truck, vehicle, or other equipment used in the performance of this Agreement. The limits of liability shall not be less than \$1,000,000 Combined Single Limit (CSL). The policy shall include provisions for thirty (30) days written notice to the Parties of any cancellation and/or modification of coverage with respect to such policy. Each Party shall be included as additional named insured on all of the other Parties' policies. The Parties may provide for the coverage required in this Section through commercially available or through self-insurance or joint insurance pools.

SECTION 403 Workers Compensation Insurance

During the Term of this Agreement, the Parties shall, at their own cost and expense, procure and maintain Worker's Compensation Insurance, at the Statutory Limits, indemnifying the Parties against any loss or claim arising from liabilities for injury sustained by employees, agents, or personnel of the Parties as required by law. The policy shall include provisions for thirty (30) days written notice to the Parties of any cancellation and/or modification of coverage with respect to such policy. The Parties shall also ensure that any subcontractor similarly provides Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of the latter employees. The Parties may provide for the coverage required in this Section through commercially available or through self-insurance or joint insurance pools.

SECTION 404 Right to Subrogation

Each insurance policy required as set forth in this Article IV shall provide that neither PVWC's Contractor, nor any of PVWC's Contractor's insurers, nor PVWC shall have any rights to subrogation against LODI.

ARTICLE V DEFAULT AND REMEDIES

SECTION 501 Default by Any Party

Any Party shall be in Default under this Agreement, if the defaulting Party fails to perform any material obligation set forth in this Agreement, for more than thirty (30) days following written notice by the non-defaulting Party, or Parties. An Event of Default includes, but is not limited to, failure by LODI to make payments of amounts due and payable to PVWC within thirty (30) days following written notice from PVWC. Material obligations directly relating to the health and safety of the public or employees shall require immediate, diligent, and expeditious action by the responsible Party notwithstanding the foregoing.

SECTION 502 Obligation to Perform

Notwithstanding termination pursuant to Article VI, each of the Parties shall be obligated to fully perform the services required by this Agreement through the date of termination. LODI shall also be subject to damages in an amount equal to the costs associated with PVWC re-procuring the Services set forth in this Agreement.

SECTION 503 Non-Waiver

- 1. The failure of any Party, or Parties, to this Agreement, at any time, to enforce its, or their, rights hereunder shall in no manner affect its, or their, rights at a later time to enforce same. No waiver by any Party, or Parties, of any condition, or breech of any provision, term, covenant or representation contained in this Agreement, whether by conduct or otherwise, shall be deemed to be or construed as a further or continuing waiver of any such condition or of the breech of any other provision, term, covenant or representation of this Agreement.
- Any payment made by LODI to PVWC under the terms of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of PVWC's rights to seek damages, in the event of a default by LODI with respect to the Services performed pursuant to this Agreement.

ARTICLE VI EVENT OF FORCE MAJEURE

SECTION 601 Event of Force Majeure

- 1. If by reason of any Event of Force Majeure, any Party shall be rendered unable wholly, or in part, to satisfy its obligations under this Agreement, and further, if the Party alleging the Event of Force Majeure shall give notice and full particulars of such Event of Force Majeure in writing to the other Party hereto within a reasonable time after occurrence of the event or cause relied upon, then the obligation of the Party giving such notice, to the extent affected by such Event of Force Majeure, shall be suspended or modified during the continuance of the inability to perform, or fully perform, then claimed. Any Party so affected shall use its best efforts to overcome such Event of Force Majeure with all reasonable dispatch.
- 2. An Event of Force Majeure, during which the initiation of performance of Services under this Agreement is prevented for more than ninety (90) days from the Effective Date of the Agreement, will justify termination of the Agreement. Similarly, an Event of Force Majeure which terminates PVWC's management and control of the System would justify termination of this Agreement.
- 3. An Event of Force Majeure which causes a material impact to the performance of Services by PVWC's Contractor or which materially impacts the terms, conditions and obligations affecting performance of any Party, or Parties, will justify an equitable adjustment that increases or decreases the price for performance of Services.

ARTICLE VII INDEMNIFICATION

SECTION 701 Indemnification

Each Party shall defend, indemnify and save harmless the other Party, and the other Party's officers, agents and employees and each and every one of them against and from any and all liabilities, judgments, threatened, pending or completed actions, suits, demands for damages or costs of every kind and description actually and reasonably incurred (including reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs) including without implied limitations, liabilities for damage to property or liabilities for injury or death of any person (including liabilities for damaged property or liabilities for injury or death of the officers, agents and employees of either PVWC or LODI) resulting from any negligent act or omission or from the willful misconduct of either both Parties, or any of their officers, agents or employees. The obligations set forth herein shall survive termination, expiration or rescission of the Agreement.

ARTICLE VIII MISCELLANEOUS

SECTION 801 Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey. The Parties hereby consent to the jurisdiction of the courts or administrative tribunals of the State of New Jersey or the United States District Court, District of New Jersey, as sole venue for any causes of action brought under this Agreement.

SECTION 802 Arbitration

If any claims, controversies or disputes shall arise out of or be related to this Agreement or the breach thereof, the Parties agree to submit the said claim, controversy or dispute to binding arbitration in accordance with the prevailing rules of the American Arbitration Association. Said arbitration shall be held in the County of Passaic, each Party to bear its own costs and the costs of the arbitrators to be borne equally by PVWC and LODI. As to any arbitration, each Party shall select one arbitrator, within ten (10) days of the event requiring said arbitration, and the two arbitrators so selected shall promptly select the third. If said arbitrators are unable to select a third arbitrator, one shall be assigned by the American Arbitration Association.

SECTION 803 Licenses, Permits and Approvals

In the event that any goods to be purchased or services to be provided with respect to this Agreement requires that either Party possess any licenses, permits or approvals issued by the State of New Jersey or any other governmental body, said Party shall procure and maintain any and all such licenses, permits or approvals during the Term of the Agreement.

SECTION 804 Authority to Enter Into Agreement

Each Party represents that it has the corporate and statutory powers and authorization to enter into this Agreement as its legal and binding obligation, and that there is no pending or threatened litigation by or against it that will, or has the potential to cause a material adverse impact on the Party's performance obligations under this Agreement.

SECTION 805 Merger Clause

This Agreement constitutes and expresses the complete Agreement and entire understanding of the Parties hereto with reference to the subject matter hereof; all prior promises, representations, agreements, understandings and arrangements relative thereto being herein merged. Any modifications or amendments to this Agreement shall be in writing and signed by both Parties, and duly authorized by the appropriate governing bodies.

SECTION 806 Binding Agreement

This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto, and to their respective legal successors and assigns, if any.

SECTION 807 Modifications

The provisions of the Agreement may be amended, modified and/or supplemented from time to time by a written instrument duly approved and executed by each Party hereto.

SECTION 808 Severability

The provisions of this Agreement are intended to be severable. If any term or provision hereof is declared or held to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable for any reason whatsoever by a court of competent jurisdiction, such illegality, invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement and this Agreement shall be continued in full force and effect as if such illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provision had not been contained herein.

SECTION 809 Availability of Funds

To the extent required by law, this Agreement is subject to the availability and appropriation annually of sufficient funds by each Party to perform the said Party's duties and responsibilities as set forth in this Agreement, provided the said Party shall not unreasonably withhold such availability and appropriation annually.

SECTION 810 Notices

All notices and other communications given by any Party to the other Party shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been given, if delivered by hand, or upon receipt, if mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, or sent by overnight courier, and properly addressed and directed to the Party to receive same at the applicable address set forth in this Agreement. Any Party may designate a change of address, or a different person or entity to which notices shall be given, by delivery of written notice to that effect to the other Party.

SECTION 811 Filing of Agreement with the Division of Local Governmental Services

A copy of this Agreement shall be filed with the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey for informational purposes in accordance with $\underline{\text{N.J.S.A.}}$ 40A:65-4(3)b.
