

It is recommended that Passaic Valley Water Commission (PVWC) continue its employee assistance program (the "Employee Assistance Program") which program, including various employee assistance services, which would continue to be made available to PVWC employees.

Subject to review and approval by PVWC's Law Department, the design and development of supporting information, implementation and maintenance of the Employee Assistance Program would be outsourced to Saint Barnabas Management Services ("Provider") of Livingston, New Jersey, by R.J. Barnabas Health of Toms River, New Jersey in the total not-to-exceed amount of \$4,092.00 for an additional one-year period commencing as soon as possible following authorization and approval by the Commission.

A copy of additional information pertaining to Provider's proposed Employee Assistance Program, is attached to this memorandum.

EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM PLAN AGREEMENT

This Agreement made as of this 12th day of March, 2021 by **Saint Barnabas Management Services**, having its principal place of business at 95 Old Short Hills Road, West Orange New Jersey 07052 (hereinafter referred to as "Provider")

AND

Passaic Valley Water Commission 1525 Main Avenue Clifton, NJ 07011

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Provider is in the business of establishing, implementing, operating and offering for sale Employee Assistance Programming, and

WHEREAS, the Client desires to engage the Provider to establish, implement and operate employee assistance Programming and to provide all professional administrative and supervisory services appurtenant thereto, and

WHEREAS, the provider desires to be engaged by the Client to establish, implement and operate employees assistance programming and to provide all professional, administrative and supervisory services appurtenant thereto,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, it is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows

I. DEFINITIONS

- A. The term <u>"RWJBarnabas Health One Source Employee Assistance Programming"</u> means the system of interrelated strategies, including assessment, referral and crisis intervention services, the Provider has developed and is offering for sale hereunder to assist Client Employees to recognize, confront and successfully address personal problems that adversely affect their psychological and physical well-being and to facilitate the Client in its efforts to identify Employees who need assessment, referral, crisis intervention and counseling services.
- B. The term "Client Employees" means the employees of Client eligible to receive program services pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The parties hereto agree and acknowledge that Client Employees are those employees for whom the Client has authorized coverage under this Agreement only, the term "Client Employees" shall include dependent family members (those persons who are eligible for coverage under the client Employee's health insurance policy).
- C. The term "Participating Professionals" means the Provider's officers, employees, agents and subcontractors responsible for establishing, implementing and operating the RWJBarnabas Health One Source Employee

Assistance Programming and for rendering the professional, administrative and supervisory services appurtenant hereto.

D. "Dependent" shall be defined as the same as defined by employees' health insurance.

II. RETENTION

Client engages as an independent contractor for the Provider to establish, implement and operate RWJBarnabas Health One Source Employee Assistance Programming and to render the professional, administrative and supervisory services appurtenant thereto.

III. TERM

This Agreement shall commence on March 12, 2021 and shall continue until March 11, 2022, unless sooner terminated as herein after provided in Paragraph VII.

IV. OBLIGATIONS

- A. The provider shall have the following obligations:
 - (i) The Provider shall devote all of the time, energy and attention reasonably necessary to establish, implement and operate the RWJBarnabas Health One Source Employee Assistance Programming.
 - (ii) The Provider shall render or cause to be rendered in a professional, competent and satisfactory manner the professional, administrative and supervisory services appurtenant to RWJBarnabas Health One Source Employee Assistance Programming. The services encompassed are set forth in Exhibit A annexed hereto and incorporated herein.
 - (iii) The Provider shall ensure that each Participating skilled and knowledgeable in Employee Assistance Programming.

- (iv) The Provider shall procure and maintain or cause to be procured and maintained such policies of general liability, professional liability, errors and omissions and other insurance as shall be necessary to insure it and its officers, employees, agents and subcontractors against any and all liability for any and all claims occasioned directly or indirectly in connection with the professional, administrative and supervisory services to be performed in connection with this Agreement. General and professional liability coverage will be maintained at One Million dollars or greater.
- (v) When on the premises of the Client, the Provider shall fully abide by and comply with the rules and regulations of the Client that are provided to the provider.

B. The Client shall have the following obligations:

- (i) The Client shall provide to the Provider reasonable access to the premises of each of its Local Employing Facilities and all rules and regulations that Provider must comply with while on such premises.
- (ii) The Client shall provide to the Provider reasonable space to conduct workshops and seminars.
- (iii) During Client Employees' normal working hours, the Client shall allow them to contact the Provider and shall furnish them with the means to make such contact. Appointments scheduled with Participating Professionals shall not interfere with Client Employees attendance

work hours, unless the Client mandates an Employee's attendance to the Provider during such hours.

(iv) Client will maintain during the performance of this Agreement, a policy or policies of insurance customary in the industry, including: comprehensive general liability, employers liability and professional insurance on an Occurrence basis with limits of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence, and workers compensation insurance with limits as required by applicable law.

V. PROFESSIONAL FEE

As compensation for the professional, administrative and supervisory services rendered hereunder during the term of this Agreement, the Client shall pay a professional fee to the Provider in accordance with the provisions of this Paragraph.

- A. For the services described in Exhibit A, Client shall abide by the terms of payment schedule attached. At the capitated fee of \$18.60 per eligible employee/per year the professional fee due under this Agreement contract will be calculated based on 220 employees.
- B. This Agreement will commence on March 12, 2021 and full payment of \$4,092.00 will be at the time of the signing of this agreement. If payment is not made within thirty (30) days of the date that such payment is due, Client will accrue late payment penalties at the rate of 1.5 per month or the highest percentage allowable by law.

In the event this Agreement is terminated in accordance with the terms and provisions of Paragraph VIII, or in the event this Agreement expires on a date other than a payment date, the Client shall make final payment of the professional fee due and owing fifteen (15) days after the termination date or the expiration date and the professional fee due and owing shall be appropriately pro-rated and shall be calculated in accordance with accounting principles acceptable to both Provider and Client.

C. Provider shall complete all treatment, which at the point of termination was already undertaken on behalf of a client employee or dependent at the agreed upon rate as included on Exhibit B.

VI. Assignment Third Party Beneficiaries

- A. Client shall not assign this Agreement or any interest herein or any right or privilege appurtenant hereto without the express written consent of Provider.
- B. No employee of the Client shall have any claim under this Agreement against Client for failure to provide the EAP benefits set forth herein. The Client's sole interest is to ensure that Employee Assistance Programming is performed and rendered in a competent, efficient and satisfactory manner consistent with currently approved methods and practices customarily observed in the Employee Assistance Programming profession. The Client shall neither have nor exercise any control or direction over the methods by which the Provider and Participating Professionals perform and render their work and functions under this Agreement.

VII. CONFIDENTIALITY

The Parties hereto shall consider and treat as confidential and shall take reasonable precautions to ensure the confidentiality of information relating directly or indirectly to the identities of Client

Employees seeking RWJBarnabas Health – One Source Employee Assistance Programming and the personal problems for which they seek the services available hereunder.

VIII. TERMINATION

Either party hereto may terminate this Agreement with or without cause by giving the other party written notice of termination thirty) 30) days prior to the effective date of termination set forth in said notice.

IX. CHOICE OF LAW

This Agreement shall be governed and interpreted in accordance with, and the rights of the parties hereto shall be determined by, the laws of the State of New Jersey.

X. WAIVER

Neither the failure or any delay on the part of a Party to exercise any right, remedy, power or privilege under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver thereof, nor shall any single or partial exercise of any right, remedy, power or privilege or privilege with respect to any other occurrence.

XI. HEADINGS

The paragraph headings herein contained have been inserted only as a matter of convenience or reference and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any terms or provisions of the Agreement.

XII. SEVERABILITY

If provision of this Agreement shall be declared invalid or illegal for any reason whatsoever, then notwithstanding such invalidity or illegality, the remaining terms and provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect as if the invalid or illegal provision had not been contained herein.

XIII. COUNTERPART AS AN ORIGINAL

This Agreement may be executed in more than one counterpart, and each executed counterpart shall be considered as the original. A counterpart signed and sent by facsimile transmission or by electronic mail in portable document format (pdf) form, or transmitted by any other electronic means intended to preserve the original graphic and pictorial appearance of a document will have the same effect as physical delivery of the paper document bearing the original signature.

XIV. RIGHTS UNAFFECTED

No amendment, supplement or termination of this Agreement shall affect or impair any rights or obligations, which shall have theretofore matured hereunder.

XV. INTERPRETATION OF SYNTAX

All references made and pronouns used herein shall be construed in the singular or plural, and in such gender, as the sense and circumstances require.

XVI. BENEFIT

This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall insure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.

XVII. NOTICE

Any notice or other communication by either party to the other shall be in writing and shall be given, and be deemed to have been given, if either delivered personally or mailed, postage prepaid, registered or certified mail, addressed as follows: Provider:

Each of the parties hereto agrees that it shall hereafter execute and deliver such further instruments and do such further acts and things as may be required or useful to carry out the intent and purpose of this Agreement and as are consistent with the terms hereof.

XIX. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

- A. This Agreement is the complete and exclusive statement of the the parties and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings, both written and oral, between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.
- B. This Agreement may not be changed orally but only by an agreement in writing signed by both parties.

additional coordination with PSE&G, will be placed on hold pending the result of negotiation between Jacobs and SHC regarding same.

- 1.02.07 Amendment 9 also does not include Jacobs' request for compensation for SN1-NDW01 Installation, nor for Jacobs' request for Support for Claim Response, which considerations, if any, for approval of amounts requested by Jacobs will be deferred pending resolution of Stone Hill Contracting (SHC)'s pending claim.
- 1.03 PVWC reviewed Jacobs' claim, and the Parties hereby agree to the claim.
- 1.04 The amount of Jacobs' requested claim (with the exception of additional professional services, including bidding and construction phase services impacts for the Levine Reservoir sub-project, which will depend on the actual timing and sequencing of that construction contract as it unfolds, and which impacts cannot be sufficiently quantified at this time) is memorialized in a 3-Page cover letter (10 pages including referenced attachments) dated January 25, 2021, issued by Russell Ford, PhD, PE, Vice President and by Linda Wancho, PE, Project Manager jointly on behalf of Jacobs to James G. Duprey, PE, Director of Engineering, for PVWC (hereinafter "Compromise").
- **1.05** By enacting this Amendment, the not-to-exceed amount of this agreement changes as follows:

Article 2 Acceptance of Compromise

- **2.01.** Acceptance of Compromise. The Parties accept the Compromise and adopt same as an amendment to the Agreement, thereby increasing the not-to-exceed amount of the Agreement by \$520,405.00 for a new total of \$5,852,443.50.
- **2.02** Compromise Incorporated. The Compromise is incorporated herein and made a part of the terms and conditions of this Amendment.
- **2.03** Effective Date. The Effective date of this Amendment shall be the date on which this Amendment is fully executed by, and delivered to, all Parties hereto and the PVWC's governing body has duly authorized the PVWC to execute, deliver and be bound by the terms of this Amendment. Unless and until the PVWC's governing body has duly authorized or ratified this Amendment, this Amendment shall have no force or effect and shall be null and void.
- **2.04** Full and Final Settlement of Jacobs' claim. Jacobs agrees that this Amendment shall constitute full and final compensation to Jacobs for any and all claims for additional compensation in connection with the agreement that were, or could have been, asserted against the PVWC by Jacobs or requested from PVWC by Jacobs as of the date of the Compromise. A claim could have been asserted if Jacobs had knowledge of one or more events that impacted Jacobs negatively in any way, whether or not Jacobs had enough information at the time to sufficiently quantify the impact and/or substantiate the claim under the terms of the Agreement. Jacobs may not reassert any claim that it has asserted previously in connection with the negotiations leading up to the Compromise.
- **2.05** Reservation of Right. Jacobs reserves the right to assert a claim or request an increase in compensation in connection with the Agreement for any claims that were unknown as of the date of the Compromise and could not have been asserted by Jacobs before the date of the Compromise. In addition:
 - 2.05.01 Jacobs reserves the right to assert a claim or request an increase in compensation in connection with the Agreement relating to impacts on the cost of providing bidding and construction phase services on the Levine sub-project, which the Parties stipulate will depend on the actual future start date and timetable for construction of the Levine sub-project, and events that may transpire during the course of construction on the Levine sub-project.
 - 2.05.02 Nothing herein shall constitute a waiver by Jacobs of its rights to seek additional compensation in connection with Project 12-P-43, provided that Jacobs' claim is permissible under this Amendment.

2.05.03 Although the PVWC foresees the likelihood that Jacobs may request another increase in their compensation under the Agreement at some point in the future, the PVWC does not take any position on future claims that have been reserved by Jacobs and nothing herein shall bind the PVWC to increase Jacobs' compensation beyond the not-to-exceed amount set forth in this Amendment.

Article 3 Construction of the Amendment

- **3.01** Agreement. The Parties remain bound by all provisions in the Agreement that are not amended herein or are not inconsistent with this Amendment. Unless a specific waiver is made herein, both Parties reserve all of their rights and claims under the Agreement as amended.
- **3.02** Severability. If any of the provisions of this amendment are determined to be invalid under any applicable state or federal laws, such invalidity shall not affect or impair the validity of the other provisions, which shall be considered severable, and shall remain in full force and effect.
- **3.03** Counterparts. The Amendment may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same agreement. Digital and/or facsimile signatures shall be deemed original signatures for purposes of this Amendment.
- **3.04** Neutral Construction. The Amendment shall be given a neutral construction, such that it shall not be construed in favor or against any party to this Amendment by reason of the extent to which any party or its Counsel participated in the drafting hereof.
- **3.05** Recitals. The recitals set forth in Article 1 of this Amendment shall be construed as terms to the Amendment and not mere recitals.
- **3.06** Signatories' Representations. By signing this Amendment, each of the undersigned represents that s/he is duly authorized to enter into this Amendment and to legally bind his/her respective Party to same.

PVWC awarded CH2M the Professional Engineering Services for the Emergency Back-Up Power and Water Storage Facilities Design, Permitting and Services During Construction on June 19, 2013. Per our original proposal, which was derived from the RFP, the construction period was to last 390 calendar days. Change Order 5 recognized a 24-month construction period and provided funding for design additions and construction phase services. The modified project budget was then \$2,069,954. Notice to proceed for the construction phase of the project was established on March 30, 2017, with completion scheduled for March 30, 2019. Change orders 7 and 8 provided funding for project management (Task 11) and resident engineering (Task 12) for the additional construction period of March 30, 2019 through December 15, 2020, with anticipated completion at that time (representing over 1,350 calendar days from start of construction). The extended construction schedule has also resulted in the need for continued engagement of the design team. These efforts have not been addressed in previous amendments, as the period of performance for the design team authorized in Change Order 5 ended on March 30, 2019.

At this time, we are requesting that you review the following additional work effort by our team to continue to support the project:

- substitute item reviews, switchgear and generators
- resubmittal reviews
- extended design team engagement during the 106 week project extension (from March 31, 2019 thru April 16, 2021)
- continued resident engineering and project management services
- escalation costs for Tasks 13-16 for the project delay (December 15, 2020 to April 2021)
- support for SN1 NDW01 installation
- support for response to claim items from SHC

Details of services rendered in each of these areas are provided in Attachment A. Whereas Attachment B identifies changes in related Work required for the switchgear and generator equipment that deem them as substitute items rather than "or-equal". Table 1 provides a breakdown of the requested funding addition of \$ 570,055 as negotiated with you for the above project work efforts through the anticipated project completion of April 16, 2021 based on the contractor's current outstanding work. Additionally, there are two held items in the estimated amount of \$ 154,800 related to work associated with the ongoing claim. Compensation for these efforts will be considered during the claim negotiations.

Although the contractor submitted a CPM update in November, current work status indicates that the final completion date of February 10, 2021 is not going to be met. Jacobs feels that the April date is possible for completion. Please note that execution of items 1 through 3 are largely complete, and this request is approximately \$120,000 less than the actual project expenditures on these items – including \$54,000 in design effort to amend design of SN1 based on changed field conditions. These charges are being held pending resolution of the work for SN1.

Item 1: Substitute Item Review

Substitute items are identified in Article 6.7 of the contract General conditions. This article identifies that the engineering effort associated with reviews of substitute equipment is the responsibility of the contractor. "The owner shall be reimbursed these costs via deduction from the Contractor's next Partial Payment following the notice of these incurred costs."

As required in that article, Attachment B identifies that the PACs switchgear and Kohler generators are substitute equipment. The total engineering expenditure for review of substitute items is \$84,287.48, PVWC has paid \$34,637.50 toward these expenditures as authorized for anticipated additional coordination efforts with PSE&G. Thus, the unpaid expenditure is \$49,649.98, as included in Table 1. PVWC can deduct the full value of \$84,287.48 from the Contractor's next Partial Payment.

Item 2: Resubmittal Review

Requirements for submittal of shop drawings and samples is identified in General Conditions Articles 6.24 through 6.28. As discussed previously with PVWC and as an industry standard of care, it is reasonable to assume that the Contractor may make one initial submittal and one resubmittal to receive the engineer's approval. As of November 13, 2020, there have been 512 submittals on the project. According to our submittal numbering system, a resubmittal with level B is a third submission, with C representing a 4th submission, etc. The table below identifies the number of submittals made 3 or more times, excluding the PACs switchgear and Kohler generators – which are captured in the substitute items work effort.

Using the total number of 328 hours for review of resubmittals B through E identified in the table, at an average hourly rate of \$182 results in a cost of \$59,700. Jacobs has accepted a negotiated reimbursement for 295 hours, \$53,694 as compensation in full for Item 2.

Item 3: Extended Design Team Engagement (March 31, 2019 through December 15, 2020)

Change Orders 7 and 8 recognized an extension in the construction time period with funding for Project Management and Resident Engineering Services from March 31, 2019 – Dec 15, 2020. However, there was no provision for continued engagement of the design team since this work effort was ongoing and difficult to accurately predict. Change Order 7 specifically excluded ongoing efforts for RFI and submittal review. Now that the construction is nearing completion – the work effort can be better quantified.

While the weekly work effort is variable, the average expenditures (above that captured above for resubmittals) can be estimated based on the total expenditures. The period of March 31, 2019 through November 13, 2020 represents 85 weeks from the end date of the CO5 period of performance. The work effort required for this time period of March 31, 2019 through November 13, 2020 approximates 18 hours per week, or 1530 hours for the 85-week period. This can be further substantiated based on the actual number of submittals and RFIs received as presented below.

The budget for submittal and RFI review was 474 hours - at an average of 4 hours per submittal, this equates to a total of 118 submittals and 30 RFIs. Looking at the total number of submittals received, it is clear that a much larger number of submittals were made over the course of the project. The table below quantifies the total number of submittals /RFIs that were not planned for in the original contract. Note that submittals made three or more times as captured above, are excluded here.

The resulting LOE for the additional submittals/ RFIs is: 343 submittals x 4 hrs/submittal = 1372 hours 69 RFIs x 2 hrs/RFI = 138 hrs
1510 hrs x \$182/hr = \$274,820

Extending this support through the current contract end date of December 15, 2020, provides an additional 4 weeks of engagement. A total of 72 hours will result (4 weeks x 18 hrs/wk) with a cost of \$13,100 at \$182/hr. The resulting total cost of work item 3 is \$287,900. Jacobs has accepted a negotiated reimbursement for 1424 hours, \$259,146 as compensation in full for Item 3.

Item 4: Extended Design Team Engagement (December 16, 2020 - April 16, 2021)

A total of 18 weeks remains from December 16, 2020 through the projected project completion date of April 16, 2021. Anticipating an expenditure of 18 hrs per week from the design team, results in a total of 324 hours, or \$60,900 at the average rate of \$188/hr (\$182 +3.5% escalation). Jacobs has accepted a negotiated reimbursement for 194 hours, \$36,465 as compensation in full for Item 4. The ongoing work efforts include submittal reviews, response to RFIs, coordination with the contractor on needs for O&M manuals, start-up plan coordination with SHC and PVWC, PSE&G coordination, and general team coordination. Note that SHC's inefficiencies in subcontractor management/coordination, lack of project scheduling, overall project management, and insufficient attention to information provided in submittals has resulted in project delays and greater project management and engineering efforts from the CH2M (Jacobs) team than planned for in our previous change orders with PVWC.

Item 5: Resident Engineering and Project Management (December 16, 2020 - April 16, 2021)

Jacobs estimates project completion by April 16, 2021. This end date represents an 18 week extension from Dec 16, 2020 through April 16, 2021. Continued services for project management and resident observation will be needed during this time.

Task 11 - Construction Administration/Office Coordination

Project management during construction is provided in Task 11, Construction Administration. A Project Management budget of 12 hours per week will be needed. Over the 18 week project extension, this will be a 216 hour effort at a total cost of \$51,410.

Task 12 - Resident Engineering Services

As requested, Jacobs will continue to provide full-time resident engineering through project completion. The additional 18 weeks to anticipated project completion by April 16, 2021, results in additional resident engineer labor of 720 hours. The current agreed resident rate is \$156/hour. At an annual escalation of 3.5% as approved in change order 7, the rate for year 2021 will be \$161, resulting in a cost of \$115,920.

The totals for these Tasks 11 & 12 equates to 936 hours, \$167,330.

Item 6: Escalation for Task 13-16

Tasks 13 through 16 will be delivered from January 2021 through project completion. Those tasks have been previously funded for completion by December 15,2020. The fiscal year delay in delivery results in a 3.5% increase in costs. The resulting budget addition requested for this escalation is identified below.

Item 7: Support for SN1 NDW01 Installation (on hold)

SHC has initiated work on installation of the soil nails and rock mesh needed to address the deficiencies in work with SN1 installation. SHC requested oversight by a Jacobs geotechnical engineer to aid in real time responsiveness to field conditions and assist them with completing installation according to the design. Jacobs provided this requested service with the full time presence of a geotechnical engineer, supported by the design engineer, project manager and other staff from the office. The field staff work effort has totaled 341 hours at an estimated cost of \$52,300.

Item 8: Support for Claim Response (on hold)

Jacobs has assisted PVWC with preparation of support documents to aid in response to the SN1 claim from SHC. Efforts have included analysis of time and material tickets, pay applications and time on-site, with development of three potential scenarios for reasonable costs incurred. Additionally, technical staff have been engaged with design analysis and development of support documents, and participation in several teleconferences with PVWC staff and legal counsel. The efforts expended through October 30, 2020 equates to 234 hours. Since the claim is not yet settled, the need for additional efforts is anticipated. It is expected that a total of 410 hours of effort will result, at a cost of \$102,500.

Attachment B

PVWC Standby Emergency Generators Project Changes in Work Substantiating Substitute Item Designation

Background

In consideration that the Kohler generators, and initially proposed PACs switchgear and associated equipment do not meet the definition of "or-equal" in General Conditions article 6.7.1.1, this equipment is considered as *Substitute Items* per article 6.7.1.2.

6.7.1.1. "Or-Equal": If in ENGINEER's sole discretion an item of material or equipment proposed by CONTRACTOR is functionally equal to that named and sufficiently similar so that no change in related Work will be required, it may be considered by ENGINEER as an "or-equal" item, in which case review and approval of the proposed item may, in ENGINEER's sole discretion, be accomplished without compliance with some or all of the requirements for acceptance of proposed substitute items.

6.7.1.2. Substitute Items: If in ENGINEER's sole discretion an item of material or equipment proposed by CONTRACTOR does not qualify as an "or-equal" item under subparagraph 6.7.1.1, it will be considered a proposed substitute item. CONTRACTOR shall submit sufficient information as provided below to allow ENGINEER to determine that the item of material or equipment proposed is essentially equivalent to that named and an acceptable substitute therefor. The procedure for review by the ENGINEER will include the following as supplemented in the General Requirements and as ENGINEER may decide is appropriate under the circumstances. Requests for review of proposed substitute items of material or equipment will not be accepted by ENGINEER from anyone other than CONTRACTOR. If CONTRACTOR

wishes to furnish or use a substitute item of material or equipment, CONTRACTOR shall first make written application to ENGINEER for acceptance thereof, certifying that the proposed substitute will perform adequately the functions and achieve the results called for by the general design, be similar in substance to that specified and be suited to the same use as that specified. The application will state the extent, if any, to which the evaluation and acceptance of the proposed substitute will prejudice CONTRACTOR's achievement of Substantial Completion on time, whether or not acceptance of the substitute for use in the Work will require a change in any of the Contract Documents (or in the provisions of any other direct contract with OWNER for work on the Project) including, but not limited

to Contract price, to adapt the design to the proposed substitute and whether or not incorporation or use of the substitute in connection with the Work is subject to payment of any license fee or royalty. All variations of the proposed substitute from that specified will be identified in the application and available maintenance, repair and replacement service will be indicated. The application will also contain an itemized estimate of all costs or credits that will result directly or indirectly from acceptance of such substitute, including costs of redesign and claims of other contractors affected by the resulting change, all of which will be considered by ENGINEER in evaluating the proposed substitute.

ENGINEER may require CONTRACTOR to furnish additional data about the proposed substitute.

Per article 6.7.3 Engineer's Evaluation, the CONTRACTOR shall reimburse OWNER for charges of ENGINEER...... for evaluating each such proposed substitute item. The OWNER, the ENGINEER or the OWNER'S Consultants shall provide to the CONTRACTOR a written itemized breakdown of the manpower and costs associated with the evaluation of any "or-equal" or substitute item and the OWNER shall be reimbursed these costs via deduction from the CONTRACTOR'S next Partial Payment following the notice of these incurred costs.

Substitute Items in Emergency Standby Power project

The following identifies changes in related Work required for the switchgear and generator equipment that deem them as substitute items rather than "or-equal".

Utility and Plant 38 KV Switchgear by PACS

- A different manufacturer (PACS) was proposed to be used by SHC rather than the basis of design manufacturer (PowerCon) which was outlined in the Contract Documents.
- An extensive number of submittals were issued by SHC for the proposed 38KV switchgear and
 associated enclosures. However, none of submittals issued to the Engineer for review contained
 sufficient information to meet all the requirements of the Contract Documents or the PSE&G PEPP
 Manual
- The proposed thickness of the metal used to construct the walls and roof of each switchgear enclosure were thinner than values specified.
- 4. The dimensions of the Utility Switchgear and the Plant Switchgear enclosures proposed are different than the dimensions of the equipment as shown on the Contract Documents, requiring a change in the equipment foundation pad.
- 5. The Switchgear included non-load break switches instead of the specified load break switches.
- The Utility Switchgear proposed by SHC included C200 CTs for protective relays while the PSE&G PEPP Manual required C400 CTs for these items.
- The submittals from SHC did not include sufficient documentation to verify that the equipment
 proposed met the short circuit ratings as outlined in the Contract Documents and the PSE&G PEPP
 Manual
- 8. The interfaces required between the various components of the plant switchgear proposed are different than the interfaces as shown in the Contract Documents because the control system proposed with the Kohler generators is different than the generator control system that was specified to be provided utilizing the Caterpillar generators and switchgear.

Based on the totality of the review items identified above, SHC withdrew the PACs switchgear proposed and decided to have PowerCon manufacture the 38KV Switchgear specified. PowerCon was listed as the basis of design manufacturer for the 38KV switchgear within the Contract Documents.

Generators by Kohler

- 1. A different generator manufacturer (Kohler) was proposed to be used by SHC rather than the basis of design manufacturer (Caterpillar) which was outlined in the Contract Documents.
- 2. The physical dimensions and weights associated with the Kohler generators is different than the physical dimensions and weights associated with the Kohler equipment in the Contract Documents as the basis of design.
- 3. The Kohler generators proposed by SHC included different values for many of the attributes associated with their generator. This includes the following:
 - Different noise values were emitted from the Kohler generators at various loads and frequencies compared to the basis of design generators.
 - b. Different fuel usage values at various loading rates from the Kohler generators were identified compared to the basis of design generators.
 - c. Different values of heat rejection from the Kohler engine to the unused fuel which is discharged to the day tank were identified compared to the basis of design generators.

- d. Different volumes of air required for both cooling and combustion for the proposed Kohler engines were identified compared to the basis of design generators.
- 4. The proposed generator control system by Kohler requires more control panels, and physical space, than was needed with the basis of design equipment specified. Additionally, the interfaces required between the various components proposed is also different than the interfaces as shown in the Contract Documents utilizing the Caterpillar generators, switchgear, and control system.
- 5. The weight and physical size of the exhaust silencer for the Kohler units is significantly larger and heavier than the exhaust silencer to be provided with the basis of design generators. This required structural design of supports for the silencers. This design effort was paid by SHC through PVWC to Jacobs.
- The power requirements associated with the jacket water heaters of the proposed Kohler generators is different than the power requirements of the jacket water heaters for the basis of design generators.
- 7. The power requirements associated with the proposed 24V generator battery chargers are different than the power requirements for the specified 24V generator battery chargers of the basis of design generators.
- 8. The fuel supply flowrates and connection points to the engine differ from the specified equipment.

Based on the above items, the Kohler generators are considered substitute equipment.

THIS AGREEMENT (hereinafter "AGREEMENT") made as of ______, 20__ between PASSAIC VALLEY WATER COMMISSION ("PVWC"), a Public Utility Company organized pursuant to its enabling statute (N.J.S.A. 40:62-108 et seq.), having its principal place of business at 1525 Main Avenue, Clifton, New Jersey 07011, and Remington & Vernick Engineers a professional firm (hereinafter "PROFESSIONAL" and/or "contractor") having a place of business at One Harmon Plaza, Suite 210, Secaucus, NJ 07094.

WHEREAS, PVWC desires professional services as applicable, to assist PVWC in its ongoing efforts related to Project No. 21-P-80 " Developing Bidding Documents for Removal of UST and Installation of ASTs at the PVWC Clifton Facility " (hereinafter the "PROJECT"); and

WHEREAS, PVWC requires Professional Services to assist it in implementing the PROJECT; and:

WHEREAS, PROFESSIONAL represents that it has the experience and the required professional knowledge to provide the professional services, and/or extraordinary un-specifiable services, as applicable (hereinafter "PROFESSIONAL SERVICES"), and as required by PVWC in this regard as set forth in the "Public Notice", "Table of Contents", and the "Request for Proposals" of the "Request for Proposals for Professional Services (or Extraordinary Un-specifiable Services)", and Appendices A, B, C, & F of the Solicitation (and including, where applicable, Appendix D with additional technical and other requirements attached thereto); all of which, along with a copy of the PROFESSIONAL'S proposal dated January 28, 2021, are collectively referred to herein as the "PROPOSAL", are attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit C; and

WHEREAS, the AGREEMENT shall be for the period of time as set forth in Appendix D where applicable, or where not otherwise set forth in Appendix D, the Agreement shall be for up to a one year period of time commencing on the Effective Date of this AGREEMENT as defined in Paragraph 19 herein, and for any extended periods authorized by PVWC.

WHEREAS, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL are desirous of entering into a consulting agreement to cover the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES authorized by PVWC and required for the PROJECT; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL agree that the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT are the following: $\frac{1}{2} \left(\frac{1}{2} \right) = \frac{1}{2} \left(\frac{1}{2} \right) \left(\frac$

- 1. PROFESSIONAL shall provide the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES authorized by PVWC and required for the PROJECT. PROFESSIONAL'S obligations under this AGREEMENT are solely for the benefit of PVWC and no other party is intended to benefit or have rights hereunder.
- PROFESSIONAL shall perform the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES as defined under this AGREEMENT at a level customary for competent and prudent professional service providers, all as applicable, performing such services at the time and place where the services are provided ("STANDARD OF CARE"). These services will be provided by professional service providers in the appropriate disciplines, and by other professionals and individuals skilled in other technical disciplines, as appropriate. PROFESSIONAL shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion and the coordination of all aspects of its services including reports and other deliverables and services provided under this AGREEMENT. The services to be performed by PROFESSIONAL shall conform to the generally accepted codes and regulations applicable to the subject PROJECT. PROFESSIONAL agrees to indemnify and hold PVWC harmless from all losses and damages resulting from PROFESSIONAL'S failure to meet the STANDARD OF CARE. Further, PROFESSIONAL shall correct and re-perform any services not conforming to the required STANDARD OF CARE without additional compensation and cost to PVWC, (including, but not limited to pending written or oral testimony, reports, etc., which might occur from activities resulting from the performance of this AGREEMENT which were caused by PROFESSIONAL'S performance). In addition, PROFESSIONAL shall indemnify and hold harmless PVWC

and its officers, agents and employees of PVWC from and against any losses, claims, damages, or liabilities to which PVWC may become subject insofar as and to the extent they arise out of the deviation from the STANDARD OF CARE in the performance of the services by the PROFESSIONAL, hereunder.

- The cost of services for the PROJECT shall be invoiced by the PROFESSIONAL on a Time-and-Materials basis, not-to-exceed \$97,808.00. Proposal shall include, on a separate page, a schedule of Professional's hourly rates for technical and related support services and non-labor expenses. PROFESSIONAL shall invoice PVWC its services hereunder after completion thereof and on the basis of reports and accompanying documents, if appropriate, on a monthly basis, including therein information as to progress in performance as against one hundred percent (100%) completion thereof and also showing amounts previously compensated hereunder, as against the total authorization. When the billing amount for actual work performed and costs incurred during the period covered by the invoice is less than \$1,000 the PROFESSIONAL shall add the service and costs to the next billing cycle. To the extent items appearing on invoices presented by PROFESSIONAL are not contested, PVWC will remit payment of the invoice as soon as it can reasonably process same in the normal course of business and barring any failure of systems related thereto or unusual staffing shortages. If at any time it appears to PROFESSIONAL that the proposed scope of services to be performed on the different aspects of any PROJECT will exceed that which was authorized by PVWC, PROFESSIONAL shall clearly indicate same in its continuing written reports. The PROJECT shall be invoiced separately. Each invoice shall include a breakdown of hours expended along with the names of individual expending said hours, along with a breakdown of charges from subcontractors where applicable and out-of-pocket expenses chargeable to the PROJECT. Each invoice shall include a summary sheet including total amount billed for the time period covered by the invoice and the time period covered, total amount billed to date, total not-to-exceed dollar amount for cost of services (said amounts as set forth or defined in Paragraph 3 herein), and balance remaining.
- PROFESSIONAL shall be responsible to PVWC for any subcontractors and outside associates or professional it engages to assist it in the performance of the services required under this AGREEMENT.
- 5. PVWC will provide to PROFESSIONAL all available information, including previous reports and any other data in its possession relevant to the subject PROJECT. Further, PVWC will be responsible for providing PROFESSIONAL access to all public and private property in connection with services to be performed for the PROJECT.
- 6. Both PVWC and PROFESSIONAL understand that the goal of this AGREEMENT is to complete all phases of the subject PROJECT in a reasonably expeditious fashion. To this end each pledges to the other full cooperation.
- 7. The services to be performed under this AGREEMENT for the PROJECT shall be deemed to be completed when the scope of work authorized by PVWC for the PROJECT has satisfactorily been fulfilled.
- 8. By notice in writing at any time, PVWC may change the general scope of services required by PROFESSIONAL as set forth herein. In such event an equitable adjustment, if appropriate, in compensation shall be agreed to in writing prior to PROFESSIONAL'S performing the changed services.
- 9. PROFESSIONAL shall hold secret and confidential all information designated by PVWC as confidential. PROFESSIONAL shall not reveal any designated confidential information to a third party unless the disclosing party was lawfully possessed with the information before receipt of same from the party claiming confidentiality and whose information has been designated as described herein as being confidential, or applicable law, regulation, court order or any agency of competent jurisdiction requires its disclosure; or the failure to disclose the information would pose an imminent and substantial threat to human health or the environment.
- $10.\,\,$ PROFESSIONAL shall maintain insurance against the following risk during the term of this AGREEMENT:
- a) Worker's Compensation in statutory amounts and Employer's Liability for PROFESSIONAL'S employees' for the PROJECT for related injuries or disease; and
- b) General Liability and Automobile Liability (each including excess coverage as required) and each in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for personal injury or property damage to third parties which arises from PROFESSIONAL'S performance under this AGREEMENT; and

c) Professional Liability in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for legal obligations arising out of PROFESSIONAL'S failure to meet the STANDARD OF CARE or other items covered under such Professional Liability policy.

PROFESSIONAL shall provide to the PVWC certificates of insurance as to each of the above which evidence that the policies are in effect.

- 11. This AGREEMENT shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey and any litigation/arbitration relating to the AGREEMENT shall be venued in New Jersey. In the event of litigation, the parties agree and consent to the action being initiated in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Passaic County.
- PROFESSIONAL represents that it is an independent professional and not an employee of PVWC.
- 13. If a dispute or complaint arises concerning this AGREEMENT, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL will negotiate a resolution of the dispute. Should negotiations be unsuccessful, the resolution of the dispute shall be submitted to arbitration in accordance with the current Construction Industry Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association and the arbitration proceeding shall be venued in New Jersey. Any decision rendered by the arbitrators shall be final. Judgment may be entered upon the decision in any court having jurisdiction. The decision shall not be subject to modification or appeal except to the extent permitted by Sections 10 and 11 of the Federal Arbitration Act (9 U.S.C. 10, 11). Notwithstanding the aforementioned, disputes which have a total value (exclusive of interest) in excess of the dollar amount for cost of services (said dollar amount as stipulated in paragraph 3 herein) shall not be arbitrated but shall be litigated.
- 14. All notices required or intended under this AGREEMENT may be delivered in person, by facsimile or express mail. All notices shall be effective upon the date of receipt by the parties. Notices shall be delivered or sent to the other party at the address appearing in this AGREEMENT. An address may only be changed by written notice to the other party.
- 15. During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:
- The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Except with respect to affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, the contractor will ensure that equal employment opportunity is afforded to such applicants in recruitment and employment, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Such equal employment opportunity shall include but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. - j) The contractor and its subcontractor shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance as may be requested by the Division from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code at N.J.A.C. 17:27.
- 16. This AGREEMENT is subject to termination at the conclusion of all of the Contract work, time being of the essence as described herein, unless extended by the mutual agreement of the Parties. PVWC retains the right to terminate the PROFESSIONAL upon 15 days' notice to the PROFESSIONAL, which notice shall be effective when given to the PROFESSIONAL in writing at the PROFESSIONAL'S place of business by way of certified mail return receipt requested and regular mail. No other Notice shall be necessary. Should termination under this Article take place, the PROFESSIONAL shall be entitled to compensation for all authorized Contract work completed satisfactorily to the date of termination. PVWC shall be the sole judge of satisfactory work.
- 17. This AGREEMENT, including any schedules, attachments and referenced documents, is the entire agreement between PVWC and PROFESSIONAL. Any prior or contemporaneous agreements, promises, negotiations or representations not expressly stated herein are of no force and effect. Any changes to this AGREEMENT shall be in writing and signed by the PVWC and PROFESSIONAL.
- 18. A waiver or breach of any term, condition or covenant by a party shall not constitute a waiver or breach of any other term, condition or covenant. If any court of competent jurisdiction declares a provision of the AGREEMENT invalid, illegal or otherwise unenforceable, the remaining provisions of the AGREEMENT shall remain in full force and effect.
- 19. The effective date of this AGREEMENT shall be as of the date set forth hereinabove, or where such date is not indicated, the effective date of the AGREEMENT shall be when the last of the two parties is in full possession of a fully executed AGREEMENT document.

- 20. PROFESSIONAL'S hourly rates for technical and related support services and non-labor expenses shall be as set forth in the PROPOSAL.
- 21. PROFESSIONAL understands and agrees that upon submission to PVWC and upon receipt of proper payment as provided for in this AGREEMENT, any reports, data, logs or other information provided to PVWC pursuant to the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT (and which are not designated in accordance with Paragraph 9 of this AGREEMENT as being confidential) are deemed to be non-proprietary to the extent that PVWC, in its sole discretion, may utilize the information submitted for whatever purposes it deems necessary or desirable without seeking permission from PROFESSIONAL, and without providing any additional compensation to PROFESSIONAL; provided, however, that PVWC shall have sole responsibility for use of such work products in applications for which they may not originally have been intended. Reports, data, logs and other information provided to PVWC by PROFESSIONAL shall become the property of PVWC provided, however, that PROFESSIONAL shall have unrestricted right to their use.
- 22. PVWC designates the Executive Director, the Director of Engineering, or the General Counsel of the PVWC as its designated representative having authority to give instructions, receive information, define PVWC'S policies, and make decisions with respect to the scope of the work to be performed. PVWC reserves the right to change these designees from time to time and will notify PROFESSIONAL of any change(s) in writing.
- 23. Except as otherwise approved by PVWC, for the PROJECT, PVWC will be responsible for furnishing all approvals and permits from governmental authorities and other entities having jurisdiction over the scope of the work to be performed and approvals from others as may be necessary for the timely completion of the said work, including payment of all permit fees.
- 24. This AGREEMENT may be executed in several counterparts and all so executed documents shall constitute one agreement, binding on all the parties hereto, notwithstanding that all the parties are not signatory to the original or the same counterpart.
